It wasn't until 1908 that the poliovirus was identified

Salk created the first vaccine for it in 1952

Sabin's polio vaccine is licensed in 1960

1979 Rotary made early efforts to eradicate polio


Polio Plus launched in 1985—125 countries still had polio cases (and at least 1,000 children a day were paralysed from it)

Global push to eradicate polio was set in 1988

2002 Polio is eliminated in Europe

2014 SE Asia declared polio free

2020—only 2 countries still have polio cases






