HIGHLIGHTS OF THE ROTARY MEETING October 20, 2022

OPENING: Peter Wilk, filling in for Greg Ledesma, called the meeting to order. Bob Stumpner led the club in prayer. Peter led the club in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Peter asked each Rotarian to place \$2 in the center of the table.

GREETERS REPORT: There were 21 members, exchange student Haruto, students of the month Harsh and Taylor, Taylor's Mother Carrie, program speakers Jim Barrett and Jim Eden in attendance at today's meeting.

STUDENTS OF THE MONTH: Taylor gave a brief talk about her accomplishments and future plans.

Taylor is currently treasurer of the HUHS Student Council, an officer on the executive council for National Honors Society, the communication coordinator on the executive council for H-Club, a 2023 School Board Student Representative. She also serves as captain of the Girls Track and Field team and the Girls Volleyball team.

Taylor received special recognition by receiving the Daughters of the American Revolution Citizenship award, being named September HUHS Athlete of the Month, being selected 2nd team all conference as a setter for girls volleyball team, and being named the 2021 most improved athlete for volleyball. She holds the school record for the women's track and field weightman relay, and the volleyball school record for total career assists. Taylor has done an extensive amount of community service through H-Club, National Honors Society, and by serving as the executive chair for the charity committee on Student Council.

Taylor plans to attend college and pursue a major in Biomedical Sciences on the Pre-Dental plan.

EXCHANGE STUDENT REPORT: Haruto played his last soccer game for HUHS this past week. He enjoyed the experience. He also sang in his first choral concert at the high school recently.

Janean Handel reported that so far 79 tickets have been sold for the craft beer walk fundraiser scheduled for October 22nd from 2 - 6 PM.

Jim Bohn reported that the Vision House is on schedule. The outer walls are almost done. The plan is to have the trusses go up the 1st week in November.

Dana Osmanski passed around the signup sheet for the Santa Hosting project. She is looking for 2 or 3 Rotarians to volunteer their time hosting Santa in the Link Building on the following dates. November 26 from 1-3 PM, December 3 from 1-3 PM, December 9 from 4-7 PM, December 10 from 1-3 PM, and December 17 from 1-3 PM. Ron Schlitt will be sending out a followup email to solicit volunteers to cover the five dates.

PROGRAM: Jim Barrett and Jim Eden presented a program on the November 8th Moraine Park Technical College referendum. Moraine Park serves 12,000 students and issues over 2,000 degrees annually. The campus needs more space to train for the growing demand for new jobs in healthcare and manufacturing. The \$55 million referendum covers four key areas.

- **Advanced Manufacturing and Trades expansion at the Fond du Lac Campus - \$13.7 million**
- **Manufacturing, Automation and Robotics Lab expansion at the West Bend Campus - \$18.5 million**
- **New Construction of Fire Training Facility - \$9.3 million**
- **Health and Human Services facility expansion at the Fond du Lac Campus - \$13.3 million**

The projected tax impact is \$21.00 per year per \$100,000 property value.
