# The Program – Chief Jeffrey Weaver – Sebastopol PD Update



At this point **CptnPresBob** called **Past-Pres. Dave Madsen** to the Roto-Altar to introduce our guest speaker, <u>Sebastopol Police Chief Jeff</u> <u>Weaver</u>. Here is what **Dave** had to say about Chief Weaver:

Jeff Weaver has been the Chief of Police of the Sebastopol police department since January

<u>2004</u>. He is a graduate of the <u>Santa Rosa Junior College Public Safety</u> <u>Training Center</u> and worked with the Santa Rosa and the Santa Rosa Junior College Police Departments before joining the Sebastopol Police Department as a <u>reserve police officer in late 1989</u>.



He was <u>later promoted to officer Cpl. Sgt. Lieut. and then Chief</u>. He graduated from <u>California State University</u>, <u>Sacramento with a Bachelor's of Science in Criminal Justice</u>. He is a past president of the Sonoma County Law Enforcement Chiefs Association and a current member of the California Police Chiefs Association Board of Directors.

In addition to his work at the Sebastopol Police Department, Jeff is an adjunct instructor for the Santa Rosa Junior College Administration of Justice program, a member of the Gravenstein Union school District Board of Trustees, and attends Hessel Church. Jeff lives in Sebastopol with his wife and twin sons.

Past Pres. Dave finished by saying that Jeff is a good guy and outstanding representative of the City of Sebastopol.



<u>Chief Weaver</u> began with some slides from a community meeting at Analy High School on January 23. The good news was that West County Union High School 9th and 11th Grade students score high (relative to the rest of Sonoma County or all of California) in Resilience [The ability to recover quickly from difficulties, toughness. **–Ed.**]

Themes emerged – Network existing resources, focus on early education, and create more jobs.

Sebastopol Area Community Alliance (S.A.C.A.) created and is using the Sebastopol Area Resource Guide that includes resources for help and education. It will be updated – and translated.

# #25: Sharing Rotary with New Members

Are you aware of the responsibility or obligation most Rotarians fail to perform? Paying their dues? Attending meetings? Contributing to the club's service fund? Participating in club events and projects? No – none of these!

Of all the obligations a person accepts when joining a Rotary club, the one in which most Rotarians fail is "sharing Rotary". The policies of Rotary International clearly affirm that every individual Rotarian has an "obligation to share Rotary with others and to help extend Rotary through proposing qualified persons for Rotary club membership". It is estimated that less than 30 percent of the members of most Rotary clubs have ever made the effort to propose a new member. Thus, in every club, there are many Rotarians who readily accept the pleasures of being a Rotarian without ever sharing that privilege with another qualified individual.

The Rotary policy on club membership states: "In order for a Rotary club to be fully relevant to its community and responsive to the needs of those in the community, it is important and necessary that the club include in its membership all fully qualified prospective members located within its territory." One merely has to glance through the pages of the local telephone directory to realize that most clubs have not invited qualified members of *all* businesses and professionals into Rotary.

Only a Rotarian may propose a customer, neighbor, client, supplier, executive, relative, business associate, professional, or other qualified person to join a Rotary club. Have you accepted your obligation to share Rotary? The procedures are very simple, and everyone must know at least once person who should belong to Rotary.
