Bill Cole introduced his guest and former Rotarian Carson Case.






Jerry Warren introduced guest of the club and soon to be inducted Jill Lowry as well as

Recognitions






The Program - City of Sebastopol Update





Henry Alker introduced <u>Larry McLaughlin</u> who is the <u>City Manager for the city of Sebastopol</u>. Larry is a graduate of UC Berkeley and Empire School of Law. He was City Attorney for Sebastopol for some 25 years and has served as City Manager for a year and a half.





Mr. McLaughlin gave an overview of the finances of the City of Sebastopol and it sounds like things are improving. The city is looking at \$5 million in revenue, about a third from property tax and 22% from sales tax. The bulk of sales tax revenues are from the food and restaurant business (not medical marijuana) and another 24% from gasoline taxes. Sebastopol had cleaned out its reserve funds by 2012 but now is in a position to replenish some of the reserve accounts.

On the expenditure side, <u>police and fire services make up 73% of the out go</u>. Budget troubles required cutbacks and furloughs in year's past but things are improving. City workers who had been given a furlough Friday were offered to return to full time work. Most chose to stay on the lowered hourly work schedule.

The <u>Barlow Project</u> is now a going concern with more store/restaurant openings anticipated. Frizelle Enos is scheduled to rebuild on the same site. A committee has been formed to explore the future of city hall and the library with a possible move being studied. Landscaping on city hall will be done by Daily Acts.

The recent lawsuit filed by CVS was discussed. After many years, CVS was given the go ahead to demolish the derelict Pellini Chevrolet building and build a new store on the site. After approval but before work commenced, a new city council board was elected and decided to declare a moratorium on drive-through access to any new building in Sebastopol. CVS filed a lawsuit in federal court alleging that the City denied it its civil rights in the matter.

The City of Sebastopol has set aside \$300,000 to litigate the issue. It most recently filed a motion to dismiss the entire matter. CVS is seeking damages. The litigation continues.

After some spirited questions and answers from the floor, President Bob thanked Larry and presented him with a donation to Polio Plus in his name.



President Bob closed the meeting promptly at 1:30 pm with the reminder to all support Rotarians' businesses.

THE ABC's of Rotary

#18: RI World Headquarters

The headquarters of Rotary International always has been in the area of Chicago, Illinois, USA. First it was in Chicago itself, but in 1954 an attractive new building opened in suburban Evanston. The Ridge Avenue building met the needs of the Rotary Secretariat until the 1980s when the addition of new programs, the growth of the Rotary Foundation, and the new Polio Plus activities made the headquarters building extremely crowded and required some staff members to be housed in supplementary space nearby.

When a modern 18-story office building became available in downtown Evanston in 1987, it appeared to meet all of rotary's space and expansion needs for years to come. The glass and steel structure, built in 1977, provides 400,000 square feet (37,160 square meters) of office and usable space. The building was purchased by Rotary International, which leases approximately two-thirds of the space to commercial tenants, until needed by future Rotary growth. The building provides a 190-seat auditorium, large parking garage and 300-seat cafeteria, as well as functional office space for the 400 employees of the World Headquarters. The executive suite on the 18th floor includes conference rooms for the RI board and committee meetings, in addition to the offices for the RI president, president-elect, chairman of the Rotary Foundation Trustees and general secretary. One Rotary Center, as it is called, enhances the efficient operations of Rotary International.
