Henry Alker introduced <u>Gail Atkins, the</u> <u>Director of Programs at Redwood Empire</u> <u>Food Bank</u>. She had been with the food bank for 14 years.



Gail shared the results of a national survey on

hunger. She focused on the results: <u>Hunger in Sonoma County</u>. They just received the results of the survey and have not analyzed all the data. What she did share really <u>emphasizes the number of people in our county who</u> have difficulty accessing nutritious and sufficient food.

The mission of the Redwood Empire Food Bank is to end hunger in our community. <u>One in six of us in Sonoma County</u> <u>struggle with food insecurity</u>. In the US, it is 1 in 7. The <u>Food Bank serves 78,000 a month</u>. That is almost double the number of seats in AT&T Park.

In Sonoma County, the <u>cost of living</u> is high which increases the number of people with food insecurity. We also have many access points to distribute food, so we do a good job of identifying and serving those in need. <u>Rotary funds</u> the Backpack program at Parkside where 24 children/families get food each week.

This hunger study is completed every four years. The information helps direct the efforts of the food bank. One current goal is to provide more healthful, fresh food and nutrition education. <u>One-half of the food distributed is fresh produce</u>.

The <u>Redwood Empire Food Bank has a beautiful new building</u>...<u>Gail encouraged</u> <u>us to visit</u> and get a tour of the facility. Of their \$7.4 million budget, 45% is individual donations.



POVERTY is

- \$11,670 or less a year for an individual
- \$23,850 or less a year for a family of four



President Ron thanked Gail Atkins for her interesting talk and presented her with a donation to The Pathway Home in her name. He then thanked both <u>District Governor</u> <u>David Del Monte</u> and **Bill Daniels** for joining us and, ringing the bell, adjourned the meeting at 1:30.

#49: Presidential Conferences

From time to time, Rotarians see promotional literature announcing a presidential or regional peace conference to be held some place in the world. Such a conference is quite similar to the annual Rotary International convention but smaller in attendance and serving Rotarians and guests in a region that is a considerable distance from the site of the international convention.

The purpose of an RI presidential conference is to develop and promote acquaintance, friendship, and understanding among the attendees, as well as to facilitate the development of international service projects, and provide a forum to discuss and exchange ideas about Rotary and activities to promote goodwill and understanding. A few peace conferences have actually initiated peaceful relations among nations with historic conflicts. Presidential conferences are considered special events on the Rotary calendar and are not held on any regular schedule. The conferences are arranged by a committee appointed by the RI president.

Rotarians from all parts of the world are always welcome to attend. Participating in a presidential conference in another region is an enjoyable, rewarding, and fascinating experience that provides another opportunity to enjoy the international fellowship of Rotary.
