Electric car batteries are spent when they can no longer recharge & operate at 70% of their original efficiency. G.M. cars have made-in-the-U.S.A. batteries. Tesla buys the battery components in Japan and assembles them in the U.S.







Alan finished his presentation, Pres. Ron rang the Roto-Meeting to a close and invited us to come out and look at Alan's Tesla Electric car.
