

John Blount started off with a slide show of the convention, <u>End Polio Boat</u> and <u>Bridge Walk</u> pre-convention events. The Bridge Walk set a record of the most people climbing on the structure (340.) A record for the most flags (270.) Fantastic Youth Exchange and RotarAct preconference programs.

The convention was held at the <u>Sydney Olympic Park</u> which was forty minutes outside of Sidney, but the city put on extra light rail trains and buses to make the trip back and forth as seamless and painless as possible. There were 19,000 attendees from 208 countries. The

Planetary sessions were well attended some of the speakers that made an impression were; Human Nature, the Motown Group, Peter Spalding group, a former Peace Fellow spoke about the global fund for children.

Tony Abbott the Prime Minister of Australia announced that Australia will be donating \$100 million to End Polio Now.

The <u>House of Friendship</u> where you can find Fellowship Groups for everything from Stamp Collecting to Polio Survivors and everything in-between. There were opportunities to buy things to support Rotary Projects [including great gifts for the grandkids **–Ed**.]



It is amazing to meet people from so many countries in their native dress. Meeting people who are always smiling and happy to be part of Rotary is rewarding and it is stimulating to see all the different Rotary programs that are being put in to action all over the world. There is so much to learn from and to share with other Rotarians.

Next year the 2015 Rotary International Convention will take place in <u>San Paulo</u>, <u>Brazil from Saturday</u>, <u>6 of June to Tuesday</u>, <u>and 9 of June</u>.



Jack Dunlap spoke about the highlights for him attending his first Rotary International convention. He said seeing 18,000 of your closest friends in one spot made the size of Rotary more than a simple statistic. Riding on the plane, bus, and train and having wonderful conversations with fellow Rotarians who have these fantastic jobs; the downside is you never see them again.

Jack was very impressed with the House of Friendship with its 360 booths, and numerous Rotary Action Groups. "There is a group for any interests' fruit cake, wines, flying, Harley Davidson, etc.

Jack also made a side trip to see the Great Barrier Reef.

President Ron shared that all the plenary sessions were as filled as the first one. The conference was a good showcase for Australia. He seconded all that **John** had said about this being a showcase of International Transportation: Fantastic light rail, buses, and ferries.

At the convention in Sydney, there was a free lunch on one day. Thirty Rotary Clubs from Australia, set up bar-b's to feed the attendees. **Ron** said he really enjoyed this meal.

Breakout sessions were numerous, unfortunately they over lapped so you could not attend them all.

Jack said that Rotary International showed they really realize that there are changes needed to keep up with the current generation. We will have some conversation in our own club about what can be done to improve communications with members, prospective members and the community. It remains to be seen what steps we decide to take.

Ron said the conference made him interested in interacting more closely with the local RotarAct Clubs, and to try to be more inclusive with our community.

John said he learned more about logistics on the Convention Committee for Korea. **Bob Rodger's** commented when you are at an International Conference, you have your badge with your name and club on it and people come up to you and say "Oh you are from John Blount's club."



With a little time left after the program, a picture of **Robin Maybury's** father came up. **Robin** said his father was 89 years old on Father's Day. 


































THE ABC's of Rotary

#43: No Personal Privileges

Frequently, friends ask whether Rotarians receive special business benefits from their Rotary membership. Should Rotarians expect a special discount or some preferential service just because they are dealing with a fellow Rotarian?

The answer is clearly "no.' The RI Manual of Procedure expressly states the Rotary position on this matter. The policy, originally approved by the RI Board of Directors in 1933, is that in business and professional relations "a Rotarian should not expect, and far less should a Rotarian ask for, more consideration or advantages from a fellow Rotarian than the latter would give to any other business or professional associate...Any use of the fellowship of Rotary as a means of gaining an advantage or profit is contrary to the spirit of Rotary."

On the other hand, if new or increased business comes as the natural result of friendship created in Rotary, it is the same normal development that takes place outside of Rotary as well as inside, so it is not an infringement on the ethics of Rotary membership.

It is important to remember that the primary purpose of Rotary membership is to provide each member with a unique opportunity to serve others, and membership is not intended as a means for personal profit or special privileges.
