

<u>Eric Johnson, Iota Press – Ancient Printing Methods</u>





Jim Passage introduced <u>Eric Johnson</u> who owns IOTA Press, a unique local printing operation here in Sebastopol. IOTA's website explains that they are "an authentic letterpress printery which makes poetry chapbooks, broadsides and graphic experiments."

Eric brought several of his antique presses to demonstrate the printing process, and to let people have a hands-on experience with it. Slightly newer than Gutenberg's model, his printers share features with machines both older and newer, but may produce a far more pleasing end product. There is a unique community of people who treasure materials printed using methods from the past, and the qualities of the

products they can create using those methods. He brought examples of his work, and demonstrated how some of them are made.

So we all learned about a craft that has been practiced since 1436 for utility, and by some just for the beauty of it.


