Chalk the program up to good timing --and a local connection --and the *Tour de France* came to life for those in attendance. Long-time Santa Rosan <u>Gavin Chilcott</u> gave the audience a fast-paced, dramatic behind-the-scenes look at international/professional cycling.

<u>Gavin</u> is the founder and the chief officer of the <u>BMC Racing Team</u> that has enjoyed an impressive history of world cycling. He also holds a Ph.D. in microbiology among other accolades.

The team's success, its intricate system of preparation in world-wide competitions, and - talk about timing -- it's *Tour de France* victory in the last 24 hours are all remarkable. However, the most interesting story was the 'Race behind the Race", as <u>Gavin</u> calls it. That is, a victory or strong finish has to include contributions from many players, the great

majority of whom are behind the scenes. <u>Gavin</u> shared the 2015 team photo, which -- by a wild estimate -- included well over 100 members.

The BMC team started as an amateur organization in 2006. By 2010, BMC had reached 'continental professional' status. In 2011, it could boast a Tour de France winner, Cadel Etans. In 2012, BMC established a 'developmental team' of under-23 cyclists. This year the team has already had three stage wins at the 'Tour'.

While the headquarters are still in Santa Rosa, the BMC Belgium facility is home to technicians, statisticians, weather consultants, medical corps, and even dietary experts --all with the same goal, team success. But a key outside variable includes sponsorships for the team.

The BMC calendar calls for 270 days of racing, as well as all of the preliminary preparations. Beyond the Tour de France event, different team members participate in several stages around the world --under all conditions, from arid to tropical to frigid.



So get your spandex on, pump up those tires, and get ready for...the next Tour de France? Or, maybe the Tour d'Organics.
