

THIS WEEK'S SPEAKER - DENIS MULLIGAN, CEO, GOLDEN GATE BRIDGE TRANSPORTATION DISTRICT



President Rick began the introduction of our speaker, Denis Mulligan, with reminiscences of his "growing up in the shadow of the Golden Gate Bridge." He commented: "You really don't know the bridge unless you walk across it and enjoyed a sunrise while driving South across the bridge."

The program by Denis Mulligan gave us a look behind the workings of the Golden Gate Bridge. Not the "bridge" *per se*, but the management of the <u>Bridge Transportation District</u>. Luckily, the District picked the right man for the job – A Cal Berkeley BSCE Graduate and Chief Engineer for 9 years; Denis Mulligan was selected to lead the District as GM and CEO in 2010. His co-workers hailed him as "an assertive leader, enthusiastic and with a keen focus on getting the job done effectively and efficiently."

Denis' job includes both large and small projects, from obtaining grants for outdoor interpretive exhibits about the science, engineering and history of the Bridge, to working on

the <u>MMB - "Moveable Median Barrier</u>", a task that would take more than 15 years to accomplish! "The Zipper" – as it is affectionately called – has already prevented many head-on collisions and saved countless lives.

This Special District includes the Larkspur Ferry Operations and Facilities, as well as the Golden Gate Bus System. It's HUGE!

Mr. Mulligan touched on a number of bits of information and then answered an avalanche of questions on many subjects (the most ever at a Sebastopol Rotary program) from the audience:



• The Golden Gate Bridge is <u>79 years</u> in age and serves <u>50 million</u> <u>customers per year</u>.

• Golden Gate is its own <u>special district</u>. It doesn't share in state or local taxes for its support.

• Besides the bridge, bus, and boat operations, the district – daily – has about <u>20,000 people walk</u> across the bridge, <u>8,000 bicycle across</u>, and <u>1,200 park their cars</u> at ferry docks in Larkspur and Sausalito.

- The Bridge Transportation District has approximately 850 employees.
- Bus and ferry service account for 25% of the Bridge traffic.
- At the midpoint between the two towers the Bridge can move vertically (go up or down) through a range of 16 feet. <u>On a sunny morning, the midpoint of the Bridge will slowly go down about two feet as the steel warms up.</u>
- •
- The color of the bridge is International Orange and the paint is (now) lead free. The color was originally the color of <u>primer paint</u>. Various groups proposed other colors (Grey, Black, others) but Orange was chosen.
- There is a direct ferry from Larkspur to the <u>Giants</u> baseball field.
- 25% of people in Sonoma County use public transportation.
- Everything is now <u>computerized</u> for all services.





• They are currently retrofitting the <u>ferry fleet</u>.

• There are <u>200 bikes per ferry</u> <u>trip</u> on all weekends.

• Thursdays and Fridays are the highest volume days.

• Suicide is an issue at the bridge, <u>153 people were saved last</u> <u>year</u>. They are building a structure on the bridge to eliminate the ability for suicide. Any attempt will be stopped in "netting" 25 feet below

• <u>All tolls are captured</u> with Smart Controls now – and, <u>if not paid</u>, <u>will show up on car license renewal</u>.

- <u>Frank Doyle</u> [Exchange Bank and SRJC fame **-Ed.**] played a major role for development of the Golden Gate Bridge.
- The original construction phase took 4 years (1933-1937) resulting in whopping \$27 million in construction costs.
- The Golden Gate Bridge's sturdy construction is designed to <u>withstand 8.0 Magnitude earthquakes</u> and up to <u>90</u> <u>mph gusty winds</u>.
- The Golden Gate Bridge boasts a hard working history and was closed only a few times since the 1930's.
- The Golden Gate Bridge is undoubtedly the <u>symbol of San Francisco</u> and the most photographed attraction in the city.
- The best ways of exploring this San Francisco attraction is simply <u>walking</u> on the East side of the bridge.



President Rick thanked <u>Denis Mulligan</u> for his update on the <u>Golden Gate Bridge Transportation District</u> and presented him with a bottle of the Club's fine liquid refreshment—Pinot for Polio. He then rang the bell closing the meeting at exactly 1:30 pm.



"The Cordell Bank National Marine Sanctuary"

Dan Howard, Superintendent Cordell Bank National Marine Sanctuary June 10, 2016

Woods Hole Oceanographic Institute

Coastal California had an unknown mystery hidden beneath the waves for many years! It was not until the late 1800's that the Cordell Bank was discovered. It is an undersea granite and rocky reef about 4 1/2 miles by 9 1/2 miles, located 23 miles west of the Point Reyes Lighthouse. It sits on the edge of the continental shelf and rises abruptly from the soft sediments of the shelf to within 115 feet of the ocean surface.

This underwater adventure will be brought to us today by Dan Howard, Superintendent of the Cordell Bank National Marine Sanctuary. He manages all site activities and staff, policy development and all interaction with local, state and federal agencies. His focus of study since 1980 has been on kelpbed ecology, predator/prey relationships and juvenile rockfish recruitment.
