


BEFORE THE BELL

TRUTH OR SHARE





President David picked three random Rotarians for a round of "Truth or Share", where they were asked questions about last week's program and issue Appleknocker.

Mike Ferguson, Bob Rogers and Dan Rasmus were the lucky three.



There was some confusion regarding the question **Mike** was asked, regarding **Jørgen Holst**'s rookie sketch last week. Safe to say there were mistakes both in Appleknocker and in the replies.

Our guest speaker was <u>Bill Rousseau</u>, Commissioner of Marriage, Clerk, Recorder and Assessor. We learned that Prop 13 dictates what the county does regarding property taxes and that residential property accounts for 2/3 of assed value in Sonoma County. Prop 13 was voted into law in 1978 and stipulates that property taxes are not to exceed an increase of 2% per year. There are 183,000 parcels in the county and the median home value is approximately \$600,000. For every \$1 collected in taxes 26 cents goes to the county and 52 cents to schools.


We learned the assessor determines property values, but does not collect taxes.

The County Clerk is responsible for conducting all elections, maintains all vital records, and all property records. This last function is crucial to our economy as it assures legitimate and legal title to property. One last fact, 79% of registered voters in Sonoma County voted in the last election.

Future Programs

April 14, 2017: Overcoming Obstacles

The Rotary Club of Sebastopol, California has a successful Youth / Vocational Services activity – now in its seventh year – that is one of our most popular programs. It's an "everybody wins" program and is designed to lead exceptional high school students through focusing/planning for the future, interacting at an adult level, and gaining confidence in presentation skills. It is not a speech contest. This is an annual club program and attracts a large club committee with different skills and interests. The program is scalable – We adapted our program from a much larger one we discovered at Rotary Club of Reno South – fitting it into our one-day event. Our participating students are not necessarily the best students or athletes but those who have been "dealt a poor hand... or at least a few bad cards" of significant obstacles as they grew up and entered high school. We choose students who have overcome these obstacles, who are planning their future, whose academic performance shows it. The students will be present at the Rotary lunch this Friday.

April 21, 2017: Bob Rubin - Magic Beasts of a Magic Place

Robert Rubin, marine biologist and Director of the Pacific Manta Research Group. He earned a Ph.D. in comparative physiology and marine ecology from the University of California, Irvine, studying animals that live at environmental extremes. He has conducted research on fish eating bats, ice breeding seals and sea elephants that dive to depths in excess of 5,000 feet on a single breath. His field studies of the oceanic manta rays have been chronicled and aired international by The Discovery Channel, Animal Planet, BBC and National Geographic.

Robert developed an interest in marine creatures as a teenager while teaching in a youth summer camp on Catalina Island, where he learned to SCUBA dive. The elegance and grace of giant mantas resulted in what is now a passionate pursuit of a scientific understanding of these charismatic giants; which he affectionately refers to as "Flying Carpets of Ebony Silk". Robert has taught marine biology at several colleges



and universities in California and elsewhere. The recipient of numerous awards for teaching excellence, he has been recognized for his teaching by the California State Assembly and Senate, The Congress of the United States, the University of California, Irvine and Santa Rosa Junior College. He is the recipient of the ASCD award for teaching excellence, and in 1996, he was chosen by The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching as the California College and University Professor of the Year.
