


President Jack Blasco opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance flawlessly led by Paul Yeomans.



He was awarded a Rotary Ambassadorial Fellowship and studied Politics, Philosophy and Economic at Oxford University, England. He became a Soros Fellow and obtained a PhD in Anthropology from Stanford. Pursuing his career in public service and international development, <u>Miguel</u> became Secretary of Ethnic Affairs for the Peruvian Government, and Director of Program and Policy for Children's Services for Santa Clara County. In 2016 he became the first indigenous Amazonian to ever run for the presidency of Peru.

<u>Powers</u>. The flower business is not easy. Mother's day alone, she has 6 florists, and 5 drivers to keep up with demand. What makes the business challenging are many orders come through Telaflora, FTD

or Bloom Net. These middlemen take over 50% of the proceeds.





Her work involves the buying, preserving, arranging, delivery of flowers, and failed to mention rent, utilities, payroll, bookkeeping and customer service. She would like for more folks to just come in and make an order over-the-counter, and not go through the big-box floral delivery services. Steve Zivolich volunteers for Food for Thought delivery. Because of his involvement there, Steve invited Mary Bigelow-Gale and Alex Newhouse to speak. Before inviting Mary up to the podium,
Steve read a touching poem written by a recipient of the services that Food for Thought offers. It was



written by a recipient of the services that Food for Thought offers. It was entitled either 'Blackberries, Strawberries, Peaches and Plums', or 'And Still You Come'.

<u>Mary</u> talked about how Food For Thought got started in 1988 during the AIDS epidemic. Folks with this new disease were dying, and also starving as they were treated like lepers. As consciousness rose, so did the caring. Kind people started dropping off food on doorsteps so

that people with HIV did not starve. Food For Thought came into being, and now serves 800 clients. There is a 600 person volunteer base and a staff of 12. Mary noted that the food delivery volunteer may be the only contact a client may have. Each client is vetted. There is a file on each with what meds

they are taking and what foods they need to eat. There are now communal meals and a nutritionist. There is no federal funding, but



funding is received through grants and fundraising. Food is medicine and Food For Thought is healing with food and love.



Alex Newhouse then spoke about how he now works at Food

For Thought through Americorp. Americorp helps non-profits that have volunteers. Americorp is a 50/50 mix of learning and contributions. Alex has attended staff and board meetings, is learning social networking, has trained volunteers, ordered and delivered food, and has assisted with issues and surprises. Americorp is a way for young folks to get involved. Alex was a weekly volunteer at FFT before an Americorp employee. **President Jack** made a contribution to Polio in the names of both our guest speakers.





July 28, 2017: Mario Uribe - Art Smart

Mario Uribe is a graduate from The California Institute of The Arts and the Oomoto School of Traditional Arts in Japan. For over 50 years, he has worked in a diversity of media, ranging from animation to public art, with the last 27 years heavily influenced by traditional Japanese arts. He has exhibited widely in this country, Europe, Asia and Mexico. His works form part of museum and private collections in the US and Europe and his public art, with a focus on community involvement, can be seen in many US cities. In Santa Rosa, Uribe is responsible for the Veterans Memorial Monument behind City Hall, the large mosaic rainbow trout across the street in Gateway Park, and numerous other murals and sculptures. He is also a founder and creative director of Artstart, a non-profit educational arts organization dedicated to training young artists for the past 18 years.

When Hearthsong was sold and moved to Peoria, ILL, I moved to J Wine in Healdsburg and managed the accounting department for 11 years. Again wanting a position closer to Sebastopol, I accepted a Controller/CFO position at Iron Horse Vineyards. Retired from Iron Horse after 10 years. Currently working freelance for very small wineries.

I am member of the Institute of Management Accountants, a Certified Management Accountant, and past president of the Redwood Empire Chapter. Also a member of the Sebastopol Chamber of Commerce and past president, current vice president. Board member of the Sebastopol Center for the Arts, currently president. Still licensed as a CPA and insurance agent.

- All schools in West County will be notified in late September that the TMG application window will be open in October.


• Committee will review all applications and make recommendations to Rotary Board for approval in mid-November.
