

THE PROGRAM - UNA GLASS - SEBASTOPOL CITY COUNCIL





Jim Passage stepped up to the mic to introduce our guest speaker, <u>Una Glass Sebastopol's Mayor</u>. Una has served on Sebastopol's City Council since 2014 when she was appointed to finish the term of her husband, <u>Michael Kyes</u>, who had passed away.

Una ran for and won a regular seat in the November 2014 election. She is a well known conservationist who has served as executive director of Coastwalk California since 2008. Born in Canada, Una is naturalized United States citizen. She chose Sonoma County to settle down in and attended Sonoma State University. Upon graduation, she started a computer business, where one of her competitors was Michael Kyes, her future husband. They were very successful in developing software. One of the products Michael developed was called Accounting Plus the rights they later sold to a big software house.

Una has applied her business savvy to her mayoral responsibilities. She has worked hard to keep 50% of the budget in reserve – In previous years the City had nothing in reserve. They had lots of plans but no good way of keeping track of it.

Una's objective has been to get Sebastopol's fiscal house in order and that entails:




- (1) Improve the budgeting process and longer term fiscal planning.
 - a. Increase the reserve and savings for future needs
 - b. Maintain what we have
 - c. Invest in the future
- (2) Plan for retirement obligations.
- (3) Develop a long term budget for Capital Improvement Projects
- (4) Clarify Community Grant Process
- (5) Implement systems to give us better information and more effective fiscal control
- (6) Consider revenue enhancement measures. (government speak for increasing income)

The City's annual budget is \$15.4 and this is money spent on

- (1) City Administration 13%
- (2) Police 47%
- (3) Fire 12%
- (4) Public Works and Engineering 13%
- (5) Planning and Building 8%
- (6) Community 5%
- (7) Debt service 2%

Our revenue comes from:

- (1) Sales Tax \$4,152,900 50%
- (2) Property Tax \$ 2,322, 000 28%
- (3) TOT Tax 480,000 6%
- (4) Franchise Fee \$324,000 4%
- (5) Licenses & Permits \$285, 000 3%
- (6) Charges and Services \$191,520 2%
- (7) Other various categories \$526,800 6% Total \$8,282,220



In addition to the above amounts, the City gets approximately \$4.8 million from water and sewer services and \$2.4 million from other special funds.

Una wanted us to know that she supports the values of the apple- and grape-oriented middle class and noted that some of our concerns are:

July 14, 2017: **DG Bob Rogers** – Banner Transfer Ceremony

Bob Rogers has been a Rotarian since joining the Rotary Club of Sebastopol in 2007. As a polio survivor, he got involved right away with Polio Plus at the club level, and in 2011 joined the District Polio Plus Committee under Larry Myers.

Bob was president of our club in 2013-14, served as an Assistant Governor for two years, and is now the District Governor for 2017-2018.

He spent his career as an airline pilot, retiring from USAirways...and now he says his second career is Rotary.

RI President Ian Riseley's theme for this year is "Making a Difference." And as Secretary John Hewko recently said, "We are on the verge of leaving the world a gift that will last for as long as humans inhabit this planet." A planet free of the poliovirus...How's that for "Making a Difference"?

Banner Transfer Ceremony - Each year the District Governor's Club is privileged to display a banner notifying all who gaze upon it that this is the club of the current District

Governor. At the beginning of the new Rotary year, usually the first meeting, the Immediate Past District Governor (IPDG) presents the new District Governor's Club with the banner for them to display during the year. This ceremony will be taking place on Friday, July 14th, during our Second Meeting. This event usually draws a number of guests from other clubs as well, to honor the new District Governor before he departs on his journey of visiting the other 45 clubs in the District. July 21, 2017: Elsa Baker, Volunteer Manager – Food for Thought



Elisa began volunteering at Food for Thought nine years ago and loved it —always leaving feeling better than when she arrived. She was hired as the Volunteer Manager at Food for Thought in 2008, carrying on the work and filling the huge gap left by the death of Stewart Scofield. Elisa was the volunteer coordinator at Canine Companions for Independence for five and a half years, and before that coordinated Artrails and was the exhibitions curator for the Sonoma County Cultural Arts Council. She was born in Noblesville, Indiana and has her masters in Library Science from UC Berkeley. She was the librarian at Ursuline High School and at Santa Rosa Junior College. Elisa has one son, Andy, and in her spare time enjoys gardening, photography, reading, and movies. As a volunteer manager, she is used to asking, begging, and pleading for time and talent. Currently there are 600 active volunteers at Food For Thought who do it all. Her assistant and constant 'canine' companion, Samir is a large yellow lab, who shares her life and her office. They live in Forestville and can walk to work every day. Both Elisa and Samir are very grateful to be working in a compassionate, caring, fun-loving environment with great staff and volunteers.

July 28, 2017: Mario Uribe – Art Smart

Mario Uribe is a graduate from The California Institute of The Arts and the Oomoto School of Traditional Arts in Japan. For over 50 years, he has worked in a diversity of media, ranging from animation to public art, with the last 27 years heavily influenced by traditional Japanese arts. He has exhibited widely in this country, Europe, Asia and Mexico. His works form part of museum and private collections in the US and Europe and his public art, with a focus on community involvement, can be seen in many US cities. In Santa Rosa, Uribe is responsible for the Veterans Memorial Monument behind City Hall, the large mosaic rainbow trout across the street in Gateway Park, and numerous other murals and sculptures. He is also a founder and creative director of Artstart, a non-profit educational arts organization dedicated to training young artists for the past 18 years.

[1] In browser search box, search "Sebastopol Rotary" and click on "Rotary Club of Sebastopol: Home Page" -or- enter "sebastopolrotary.com" in browser address bar, then press Enter.

Rotary Club of Sebastopol web page comes up. (This is the public area anybody can see.)




To Enter the secret Club area:

[2] Click "Member Login" in top right hand corner.



[4] Notice you are still seeing the web page but "Member Area" has appeared in top right hand corner - click on that -You'll see "Administration" page ("Admin" tab in top row of page)



[5] Click on "Committee Management" in right hand column (in "Membership Manager" - The Committees list comes up - Note list is in groups by director and Chairs names are shown. (Be sure it says "Current: 2017-2018 at top.)

Forgot?

Click on any committee name – See members of that committee. (If you don't see your own name listed and want to be in that committee, contact Chair - Only they can change Clubrunner listing.)

Click on "Go Back" at bottom of page (or on left arrow at top left of page) to go back to Committee Management.

Click on another committee name – This time try "Membership" in "Club Services."

[6] Click on SubCommittees at top of page – Note there are two subcommittees (currently)

Click on "After Hours" – See members of subcommittee.



[7] To return to Administration Page, click on "Admin" in top line, left end then click on "Admin" in next row down.

To exit ClubRunner, close your browser [8], AFTER clicking "Log Out" [9] at top right.
