



October 6, 2017: Carla Rodriguez, Deputy DA – Fraud, scams and other types of elderly abuse

Carla Rodriguez has been working as a Deputy District Attorney in Sonoma County for over 20 years. She is currently assigned to the Elder Protection Unit where she prosecutes cases involving physical abuse, theft, embezzlement, and neglect of elder adults. While attending Santa Clara Law School, Ms. Rodriguez interned for the San Francisco District Attorney's Office and immediately decided to pursue a career in criminal prosecution. Since working in Sonoma County, Ms. Rodriguez has handled a wide variety of assignments and has taken over 75 cases to trial.



October 13, 2017: Supervisor Lynda Hopkins – District update: Initiatives, strategies and concerns

Supervisor Lynda Hopkins is in her first term representing the geographically large and economically diverse Fifth District. Her District includes the entire Sonoma County coastline, the lower Russian River, many unincorporated rural villages, the city of Sebastopol, and the Southwestern portion of the city of Santa Rosa. Lynda's interest in public policy and land use began while attending Stanford University, where she studied environmental problem solving focused on coastal land use, mass transit, land use policy through the Earth Systems (BS, MS) Program. She also received a Bachelor of Arts degree in creative writing, which led to her work as a journalist focused on local government. After earning her Master's from Stanford, Lynda and her husband Emmett moved to his childhood home in Sonoma County. Lynda is a passionate advocate for environmental protection, coastal access for all Californians, social justice, and early childhood education. In addition to her involvement in the agricultural community, she also serves on the Children's Museum of Sonoma County Board of Directors.
