Julie Meridian, an artist and graphic designer who has designed core parts of Adobe and LinkedIn projects, shared some of her work for Operation Photo Rescue. She started out explaining that she is a representational artist. After working for Adobe and Linkedin, she has her own company, **Make it legit**.

Operation Photo Rescue (http://www.operationphotorescue.org/) was started after Hurricane Katrina in August of 2005. They are a non-profit that provides a free service in restoring photos damaged by floods, hurricanes, or any water damage disasters. They found people throwing away damaged photos. A group of photo experts gathered together and visited disaster areas to find photos they thought could be restored.



Julie explained that a flatbed scanner, camera and tripod can be used to give them physical and digital copies that can be restored from photos damaged by mold, sun fading. She then went on to explain, using damaged photo pictures and the restored photo examples, that there were several methods that can be used in restoration. She showed photos showing tone correction, color correction, preserving texture, sampling other sources and working in pairs (using another photo to help restore an original.

What can you do?

- 1. Copy and backup your own photos in digital format and put them in the cloud.
- 2. Share your photos with friends.
- 3. Copy photos when you find them. (All those photos that are stored in the attic, garage, basement or closet.)
- 4. Remember now take lots of photos and videos.

May 10: The Honorable Tomochika Uyama, Consul-General of Japan

Consul General Tomochika Uyama began his career with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan in 1986 and has been involved in the diplomatic service for over 30 years. His assignments overseas have included postings in Egypt, the Philippines, the Republic of Korea, and the Permanent Mission of Japan to the International Organizations in Geneva. His domestic assignments in Tokyo have included positions at the Economic Affairs Bureau, Latin American and Caribbean Affairs Bureau, and in the Ministry of International Trade and Industry.



May 31: Dr. Abhijit Kale - The Buck Foundation

Originally from Pune, India, Dr. Kale did his undergraduate studies in microbiology at the University of Pune. He started his research career at Tata Institute of Fundamental Research in Mumbai, India, where he studied endocytosis in metazoans under the guidance of Dr. K. S. Krishnan. He received his master's and PhD degrees from the Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York, where he studied the role of cell competition during development of an organism in the lab of Dr. Nick Baker. He is currently a SENS postdoctoral fellow in the Campisi lab, where he is studying the interaction of senescent cells with immune cells. In his



free time, he likes to hike and travel. Novato's Buck Institute is the largest independent scientific institute in the Bay Area. The Buck aims to end the threat of age-related diseases for this and future generations by bringing together the most capable and passionate scientists from a broad range of disciplines to identify and impede the ways in which we age. Its goal is to increase human health span, or the healthy years of life. Globally recognized as the pioneer and leader in efforts to target aging, the number one risk factor for serious diseases including Alzheimer's, Parkinson's, cancer, macular degeneration, heart disease, and diabetes, the Buck wants to help people live better longer.

There are more than 40 hours per week of tutoring hours. Most tutors work 1:1 with the same 2-3 students (Attachment Details: 65 students total, 54 tutored 1/week, 9 tutored 2/week, (By grade level: 9-K, 11-1st, 17-2nd, 12-3rd, 14-4th) (Primary Focus of Sessions: 14-Early Literacy, 21-Reading Practice, 15-Language Arts

Assignments, 7-Math support, 7-Mixed LA/Math Assignments))

CRAB FEED FUNDRAISER (Co-Chairs: **Scott Briggs** and **Patrick Dirden**) – Beginning planning for next year. **Patrick** reports: "I'm working on an e-thank you card for all of the Crab Feed volunteers.
