Of the 14 cases, 11 were in Afghanistan, and 3 in Pakistan (down from 306 cases in 2014!). But wait, there's more! Nigeria has not had a case of polio in two years! Syria has had no cases this year, despite an on-going civil war. In Papua New Guinea, 300,000 children have been vaccinated. The Global Polio Eradication Initiative has raised over \$14 billion towards the eradication of polio.

Their work is backed by millions of volunteers worldwide. It's getting close to the second annual District 5130 Pedal for Polio event. This time, **Bob** is asking all members to pledge \$65 for the riders. Pledge early and pledge often! **President Larry** reminded the club to consider donating to Programa de Becas. This program gives poor children in Mexico to receive an education. Most children in Mexico only make it to sixth grade. Consider sponsoring a child at the \$250 or \$350 level. Jim Passage stepped up to the lectern to introduce our guest speaker, <u>Michael Gillotti</u>, founder of the Sebastopol Peace Wall. Jim prefaced <u>Michael's</u> presentation by proclaiming that nothing in life is easy, especially when you are protesting against war, and military policy.

But, our speaker, <u>Michael</u>, overcame many obstacles. <u>Michael</u> told us that he got the inspiration for the wall during the Iraq/Afghanistan War. He felt that peacemakers were not given a voice, as the microphones were aimed at the war hawks. <u>Michael</u> wanted to do something, in a great and lasting way. He got together with others to create a monument, located in Downtown Sebastopol, for the peacemakers.

Today, the wall stands as a monument to the peacemakers; a place to pause, reflect, and meditate. Each year, local and world-renowned peacemakers are listed on the wall. This year, four new names will be added. <u>Daniel Ellsberg</u>, known for his work on the Pentagon Papers. <u>Dolores Huerta</u>, one of the co-founders of the United Farm Workers.

The two remaining inductees are local residents. <u>Tui</u> <u>Wilschinsky</u>, who leads Dancers of Universal Peace, which teaches cultural understanding through dance and meditation. <u>Therese Mughannam</u>, who was born in Palestine, and has been an outspoken advocate for peace. The induction ceremony will be on Saturday, September 15<sup>th</sup>. <u>Michael</u> shared an emotional poem with the group, which summed up his inspiration for taking on a crusade for peace. The loss of friends on the battle fields of Vietnam was hard. But, for <u>Michael</u>, what was even harder, was the lifelong pain inflicted on those who returned from Vietnam. He was saddened by the physical, mental, and emotional pain war caused. <u>Michael's</u> words resonated with many people in the audience. <u>Michael</u> was asked if the current rise of nationalism and tariffs are pre-cursers to global war. He suggested that many conflicts were sparked by those trends. He was also asked if climate change advocates would be considered for the wall. He suggested that it was a possibility. **Yvette Williams van Agglen** thanked <u>Michael</u> for his courange and determination for making the wall happen. **President Larry** presented Michael with a donation to Polio Plus, vaccinating 50 children.



At 1:30PM on the dot, **President Larry** struck the hearty Roto-bell, bringing another meeting to an end. **Larry** polled the audience, and asked if everyone missed the slides. Well, the club was saddened by the absence of the soft glow of the projector. The slides will be back by popular demand next week.

#### August 31, 2018 – Congressman Jared Huffman



Representative Jared Huffman (D-San Rafael) was sworn in as a member of the 113th Congress on January 3, 2013 to represent California's second district. The district spans from the Golden Gate Bridge north to the Oregon border, covering six counties including all of Marin, Mendocino, Humboldt, Trinity, and Del Norte, and much of Sonoma Counties.

Huffan is a member of the <u>Committee on Natural Resources</u> and the <u>House</u> <u>Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure</u>. Prior to his election to Congress in November of 2012, Huffman served six years in the California State Assembly where he authored more than 60 pieces of successful legislation and received numerous awards for his legislative leadership. Huffman chaired the Water, Parks, and Wildlife Committee, served on the Budget Committee and was co-chair of the Legislative Environmental Caucus.

#### September 7, 2018 – El Molino High School Dance Company

The El Molino High School Dance Company is an extra-curricular troupe selected through judged auditions, performs at school rallies, community events, athletic events, and fundraisers, a distinctive presence at nearly every major El Molino High School event..One in every six (6) El Molino High School students is a dancer, part of a remarkable athletic program that reaches into every corner of the campus life.The Dance Teacher herself, Jolene Johnson knows first hand that dance is physically and mentally demanding.



In Johnson's dance classes, students learn dance history, anatomy, nutrition, fitness, choreography, performance, movement, creativity and improvisation. They study ballet, jazz, modern and hip-hop, plus research choreographers and critique other works.
