Today's program was on Effective Public Speaking as nurtured and taught by the Toastmasters. Each Toastmasters group is somewhat different but all of them strive to teach effective public speaking. When polled. People indicate that their number one fear is public speaking. Their number two fear is death. Jennifer said that this fear can be overcome. Yes, somewhere in your brain is a tiny voice telling you to fear. But the fear is a survival fear and once recognized, it can be beaten.

<u>Dave</u> noted three keys to watch for in a good speech. *What I Saw* – the overall presentation with eye contact, gestures, body language. *What I Heard* – the importance of content, not too much detail, good vocal variation. *What I Felt*- was this talk inspirational? With these key elements, a speech can be critiqued to help the speaker improve. People often feel that mistakes equal failure which leads to rejection. In fact, mistakes are an opportunity for growth.

It has served thousands of women over the last 15 years. Pat has raised more than five million dollars for local charities in her career. In October of 2017, Pat was evacuated from her home in Kenwood and took to the airwaves of KSRO radio the night of October 8th. It was one of the few modes of communication available for fire information, and Pat stayed on the air for the next 24 days. In September of 2018, Pat was given broadcasting's highest national honor, the Marconi Award, for her service to community during that historic time. She now dedicates her show to North Bay news and Recovery.

TOOLBOX DISTRICT GRANT (**President Larry Ford** and **Keller McDonald**, Responsible Assignees) – [See also above under FAMILY SAFETY / DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS COMMITTEE] No new report.

MAP YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD DISTRICT 5130 COMMITTEE [Chair: <u>Richard Ruge</u>, Sunrise, Contact: **Tom Boag**):] – An important life saving project for all members and their neighborhoods before, during, and after a disaster – fire, flood, earthquake. The long and short of it is: We need to have several members step up to get this off the ground. More help from the Sunrise

club is needed as well. The project is a pilot project to see if it is feasible for Rotary District 5130 wide. Check the details here:

The Map Your Neighborhood program progresses – $G_LA_C_IA_L_A_Y$. (How quickly people forget... or put out of their minds... historically common after a disaster... likely from burnout/overload... even with a new Paradise Fire reminder.) We should start thinking about larger-damage-potential, long overdue earthquake risk – see Rodgers Creek, a New Map, greater hazard USGS – Lisa Wald, July 2018). Even local County and some cities are finally restarting disaster preparedness programs like they had in the past.

Fourteen Friday Club members are "still interested in pursuing MYN" and five have actually made some start by talking to a few neighbors (from phone surveys by TB, JB, BR). [Update: One trained coordinator, Les Crawford, completed his neighborhood meeting yesterday (1/13), they had a great response, and are planning a second session in a couple of months.] Unknown interest or progress for the nine trained Sunrise Club members and attempts to get a Sunrise Committee member to survey have not succeeded.

The original Rotary District 5130 plan of offering the MYN program to all 47 clubs has not begun and proposed calls to four Petaluma-area Rotary Presidents – to see if they would be interested in participating – were not made as far as I know. The MYN program is super inexpensive to produce and adequate budget is at hand – from Friday Club budget and a directed donation (Exchange Bank) and other offers.

The essence of running a volunteer program like this is having a dedicated active (and sufficiently large) committee (of MYN or Disaster-Prep-experienced people) very available to check in, follow up, and assist newly trained neighborhood coordinators. Also essential is to keep track of interest, progress, and requests for help – using a tracking system like the one we have. Two potential new (Friday Club) committee members have indicated an interest in helping the committee and leveraging their neighborhood and other experience.

VOCATIONAL / YOUTH SERVICE AREA – DIRECTOR HAL KWALWASSER:

INTERACT (**Chair/Coordinator: Barbara Bickford**): The Adopt-a-Family was a big success. The three schools adopted 23 families with 64 children. The budget was \$3,500, and we spent \$3,492. Sebastopol Fire gave us two firetrucks and Gold Ridge one truck so each Interact Club had a truck. Santa showed up! **Harvey Henningsen** took amazing pics. Vanguard Properties provided huge food boxes for each family. Although there was rain early on that Saturday, it stopped so it was clear for delivery time. Brook Haven is doing a coat drive in January and selling lollypops as a fundraiser in February.
