

They will go to first responders, health care workers, grocery store and essential business workers, and others. This project is ongoing and there is still time to donate to this fund.

Richard Power, **Jack Blasco** and others are overseeing The Rotary Club of Sebastopol's Community Crisis Project. They have already distributed \$20,000 in the community to hard hit businesses and other community projects such as CERES. There will be more money distributed in the coming days.

Michael Hixson was unmuted to describe his new project along with wife <u>Daranee</u>. They are working together on the Immigrant Resilience Fund. This Fund will raise money for the undocumented in California who are really taking a beating during the pandemic. **Michael** and <u>Daranee</u> have partnered with the State of California and <u>Governor Newsom's</u> office on this fund. The fund will accept donations and combine with State of California funds to try to ease some of the pain. **Michael** and <u>Daranee</u> have set a goal of 50 million dollars in fundraising for this endeavor. Way to go **Michael**.

John Blount introduced our Zoom speaker Jim Marggraff. Jim is a Bay Area Rotarian who is instrumental in a new Rotary program called Volunteer Surge. Jim is an inventor and futurist who has a long history of inventing useful products such as the Leap Pen and a digital pen. Today he is focusing on Rotary and what it can do in the world.





Jim described the new program Volunteer Surge. It is an online training platform to train a million volunteers. Presently, our healthcare system is experiencing a massive strain. Volunteer Surge is designed to help. The program can be easily accessed at TGIG.org.

On TGIG.org (short for the Global Initiative Group) you will be directed to several programs. One

training platform is for Telehealth Volunteers. This is an 8 to 10 hour training program on how to provide immediate support to patients via computer or telephone. Thousands of people are shut in during the pandemic. This training course gives one the tools to reach out and help.

Another possibility is the 30 to 35 hour course for Community Health Workers. For those people interested in a career in the medical field, this course trains one to provide basic care and free up doctors and nurses.



These courses are absolutely free. Jim showed a video of Dr. <u>Sten Vermund M.D Phd</u> and Dean of the Yale School of Public Health. Dr Vermund spoke of the value of Rotary training a million volunteers to help the medical professionals right now. This video is available to view on TGIG.org.

Rotary Club of Sebastopol – Board Report Summary – April 14, 2020

President's Report to the Club for April 2020 Fellow Club Members and Friends,

We continue to have virtual club meetings weekly via the Zoom online platform while shelter-in-place orders are in effect. Virtual meeting attendance has hovered around 60 members, which is respectable. We've also had two virtual happy hour -- although the beverages enjoyed by many during these events have definitely NOT been virtual. We have also enjoyed several excellent speakers during our Zoom meetings. It's great to see club members' faces and stay in touch with our Rotary family when we can't meet in person.

Hats off to **Tom Boag**, **Ken Jacobs** and other Zoom tech helpers; and **Jorgen Holst** and the Program Committee for keeping us connected and helping our club move forward!

Our huge news for April is the robust way our club has responded in service to the community. Our pass-the-hat effort generated nearly \$1,000 for bonus gratuities for the Trends Catering staff impacted by our not meeting as usual on Fridays. We raised over \$4,000 in a different pass-the-hat for our club's "Feed the Frontline" partnership with Rotarian **Mario Ramos** and Mexico Lindo Restaurant which will provide hot meals for first responders, health care workers, social workers, grocery employees, and other essential workers who are accepting big risks to keep our community running.

Our club also launched a new effort, the <u>Community Crisis / COVID-19 Support</u> <u>Committee</u> comprised of **Past Presidents Jack Blasco** and **Richard Power**, Co-Chairs, and **Past Presidents Aleia Coate** and **Gene Nelson**, Committee Members. Using club funds and a \$500 grant from Rotary District 5130, the Rotary Club of Sebastopol fast-tracked the following community crisis responses:

- \$15,000 to the <u>Sebastopol Area Chamber of Commerce</u> for grants of \$500,
 \$1,000 and \$2,000 to small businesses for crisis response
- \$2,500 to West County Community Services for COVID-19 food, sanitation and health support to seniors, shut-ins and homeless
- \$2,500 to the Ceres Project for meals to medically fragile community members

The Community Crisis / COVID-19 Support Committee will be recommending in the near future how to distribute another \$5,000 based on community needs.

Let's stay connected and focus on service as we move forward to better days ahead for our local and world community!

Community Volunteer Projects (**Diana Rich**, Chair) – Just before the shelter-in-place rules would have made it impossible this Committee (**Jim Pacatte** and **Tom Dilley** in particular) worked with some youth volunteers to reconstruct the rear exterior stairway at the Sebastopol Senior Center.

CRAB FEED (**Patrick Dirden**, Chair; **Scott Briggs**, Secretary; **Nao Noguchi**, Secretary) – As noted previously the Crab Feed was a sell out and a huge success, netting \$26,302.80, which I believe is a new record!! The Committee met Feb 27 for an event wrap-up meeting. The Holy Ghost hall has already been reserved for the second Saturday in February, 2021 (Feb 13).
