


**President Keller** showed a picture of **Nao Noguchi** with all seven of his grandchildren including the newest.

**Paul Thielen** won the caption contest award in an unnamed local publication (not the AppleKnocker- we don't have cartoons). Pretty funny **Pau**.








Everyone got a raffle ticket this week, except **HH**, so **HH** got to pull the winner from the jar. **Ken Silveira** held the lucky ticket and was faced with a choice. For \$20 – he could name the state from which our current Rotary International President hales – For \$5 he could take a lifeline from the audience. **Ken** chose to go it alone, hoping against hope for that magical \$20 payout. He guessed....He was wrong. No – not Pennsylvania. With some prodding **Ken** finally said





the correct answer Alabama. He was given a measly \$5 prize which he immediately donated to the Laguna Foundation.





Our program was brought to us by <u>Dr Wendy Trowbridge</u> Director of Restoration and Conservation Programs at the Laguna de Santa Rosa Foundation. The mission of the Laguna Foundation is to not only conserve and protect but to instruct. <u>Dr Trowbridge</u> presented an in depth look at research presently be conducted by the Foundation on Vernal Pools. Vernal Pools are found in many place in California but each has unique characteristics. Vernal Pools are endangered by development as they cease to exist when the developers move in.

Vernal Pools in the Laguna area are naturally occurring pools that fill in the winter rains and dry up in the summer heat. Due to the hardpan nature of the ground below, the water does not drain. This wetland

nature gives rise to various unique strains of flora including meadowfoam, goldfields and Sonoma sunshine. If the Vernal Pools go away, these also go away. Also many strains of fauna flourish only in Vernal Pools as they have adapted to the wet dry nature of the pools.

When it was first realized that the pools were in danger, the State of California took action to protect the pools. It turned out to be too much love. The pools started to shrink and it was determined that the ban on grazing near the pools was causing their demise. Now through careful management, the pools are being brought back as they are more fully understood. Careful conservation and management are being employed to save the pools and their unique characteristics. Developers are often required to pay into a fund for mitigation which helps pay for this work.





President **Keller McDonald** gave a final shout out thank you to **Mario Ramos and Rick Wilson** for pulling together a great tamale lunch (They really are delicious)! Watch for that Survey in a mailbox near you. Fill it out. It will really help the Club.





While most of the Roto-flock fled for the local golf courses or their offices, a couple of Rotarians, including your humble editor, stayed for a tour of the native garden. The garden is home to hundreds of local plant species, and is shared with the Sonoma County Native Plant Society. Most of the plants are used for wetlands projects within the Laguna watershed, or for restoration of areas hit by the 2017 wildfires.

He directed the Outdoor Classroom Program, including wilderness trips, at the Ojai Valley School from 1989 to 1992. In his spare time he enjoys offshore kayak fishing, wild foraging, farming his front-yard, and playing music in the "Sonomacana" band Cahoots. Craig lives in Santa Rosa with his wife Lee Hackeling and their two children.

#### **COMMUNITY SERVICE AREA – SCOTT BRIGGS**, DIRECTOR:



COMMUNITY GRANTS (Linda Johnson, Chair) – Committee work not yet started. I am working with Linda and Robin to prepare schedule to share with Committee, and our Board, for next steps, i.e., when application requests go out, when applications due, when Committee will meet to review applications and prepare list of award recommendations for Board review, and when grants will be announced.

COMMUNITY VOLUNTEER PROJECTS (**Diana Rich**, Chair) – The Community Volunteer Projects Committee recently repaired window trim damaged by dry rot at the Senior Center. This project was picked up by **Jim Pacatte**, who was contacted by <u>Linda Civitello</u>, executive director of the Senior Center. **Jim** worked with City of Sebastopol Public Works Superintendent <u>Dante Del Prete</u>, who agreed to loan some needed equipment. **Jim** bought the necessary lumber, gathered up his tools and truck,

and we met on Wednesday July 31 to get the project completed. It took from 8am to noon. The majority of the work was done by **Jim Pacatte** and **Scott Briggs**, with **Tom Dilley** helping at the beginning. **Diana Rich** helped by bringing refreshments and cheering everyone else on. The work was done on windows facing the public parking lot that sits between the Senior Center and the Library. There is a total of twelve windows on that wall, nine large ones above and three small ones below. As it turned out, most of them had severe dry rot. **Jim** and **Scott** and **Tom** ended up working on eight of the twelve windows (six on the top and two on the bottom). The trim was in general in bad shape, with substantial dry rot damaging the side and bottom pieces. In one case, even the top trim was rotten. All damaged pieces were removed, new pieces were cut to size, and then installed. In the end, all was left nicely repaired, in primed condition for new paint. Linda <u>Civitello</u> was very appreciative, and kindly offered us lunch at the Senior Center. It was a satisfying day of doing very good work for an incredibly worthwhile nonprofit that provides invaluable services to our community. Total cost of the project: \$388.87.

CRAB FEED (**Patrick Dirden**, Chair; **Scott Briggs**, Secretary; **Nao Noguchi**, Secretary) – **Patrick**, **Scott**, and **Nao** have scheduled a mini retreat on August 15th to start preparations for the Crab Feed. A meeting with the full committee will take place in early Fall.

DICTIONARY PROJECT (Paul Yeomans, Chair) - Aside from finalizing Committee membership, nothing new to report.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS (**Stephen Zollman**, Chair) – This Committee held its first meeting after our Regular Rotary meeting on July 26. As a first Committee effort it is preparing and will present a Domestic Violence Awareness panel discussion at our October 18 Rotary meeting. October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month. They are hoping to have a sitting judge, a District Attorney, a defense attorney, etc., on the panel.

LEARN TO SWIM (**Rick Wilson**, **Greg Jacobs**, Co-Chairs) – **Greg** reports that kids are not yet back to school, though he will soon be contacting schools to let them know next year's schedule. He anticipates that, as last year, we will once again be teaching nearly 400 students. Greg will be preparing a budget request very soon. He is also confident we will once again be receiving a large donation from a local program-supporter family for Learn-to-Swim.

LEARN WITH ME (TBA, Chair) – Nothing new to report. President Keller tells me this is still a work in progress.

MARK SELL ROTARY TEACHER GRANTS (Jack Blasco, Chair) – Activity will begin in early September when notification of the application opening date for the Fall round of grants will be emailed to each school principal in our service area. Applications will be accepted from around mid-September to mid-October.

PEACE AND CONFLICT RESOLUTION: (Henry Alker, Chair) – Nothing new to report other than finalization of Committee membership.

SPONSORSHIP COMMITTEE (**Ellen Harrington**, **Patrick Dirden**, Co-Chairs) – **Ellen** reports that they have a couple of Sponsorships coming (details to come), and more in the works.

David Schreibman and his team are working hard to bring some new and exciting live auction items.

**Ellen Harrington** has been working with her team to secure local Wine Makers to partner with the Rotary Club for this event. The concept is each winery that participates brings their wines to the designated table and discusses them with those who have chosen to sit at that table. Eight guests will register to sit at that table and will be paying a premium for that luxury. Currently, Russian River Vineyards, Hallack, Hannah and Balletto have agreed to participate.

I have asked **Linda Johnson** to chair and she might be interested but we need to know more details from Analy.
