President Keller introduced <u>Leslie Lopato</u>. <u>Leslie</u> and her group *Better Angels* have taken on the enviable but difficult task of bringing together people with opposing political viewpoints and fomenting discussion and understanding.

Everyone knows that this country and its politics are polarized and people talk past each other. *Better Angels* uses a variety of techniques to bring people together, not with the goal of changing minds but with the goal of bringing about understanding and furthering communication.

One method is to take a group of perhaps red state types and place them in a circle. Then blue state types sit around the outside of the group. The red state types talk amongst themselves while the blue state types listen. At this point, they do not interact. Then the groups switch places. At some point, the groups are allowed to speak to each other but not for the purposes of debate but for the purposes of clarification. These techniques are adapted from family therapy and produce results.

Leslie was highly encouraged after she took a close look at Rotary and discovered the Four Way Test. She said that this is exactly the type of communication and understanding that her group is trying to foster. *Better Angels* presents workshops, training and the fish bowl discussions described herein. We wish Leslie good luck in her endeavors to bring us together.
