BEFORE THE BELL







Steve and **Terry Beck** had a wonderful anniversary on June 18th. We learned that **Steve** and **Terry** opened up a grand bottle of Argentinean Red Wine to celebrate the day. All of the others celebrating anniversaries, **Brendon** and **Hannah Houston** (June 17th), **Harry** and **Jean Polley** (June 17th), and **Dave** and **Carleen** Madsen (June 19th) skipped town. Congratulations to everyone.





Keller swung the Roto-spotlight on World Community Service Committee chair, **Bob Rogers**, and all of the international projects our club has participated in over the past two years. **Bob** spoke about five projects, the first of which is the Chidamoyo Hospital in Zimbabwe. Our club has donated a generator, an ambulance, and blood machines. Recently, we replaced every mattress in their hospital. Near Puerto Vallarta, we worked with our sister club, Puerto Vallarta Sur, to provide high capacity water filers to families that rely on a polluted water source. The filters, which are placed in buckets, are constructed by volunteers, and have a ten-year shelf life. We worked with Rotary Club One in Chicago to help bring cervical cancer screenings to Senegal. They have the 15th highest cervical cancer rate in the world. In Tanzania, we worked with the Sunrise Club, the Rohnert

Park/Cotati Club, Santa Rosa East Club, and the Petaluma Valley Club to bring a water catchment system to a school. Students were originally forced to carry water buckets two miles each day.




The catchment system and tank stopped this practice. Additionally, we provided proper toilet facilities, which benefited young women starting their menstrual cycles, whom historically drop out of school because of this. Finally, **Bob** spoke about a water project in Rigones, Honduras. Our club helped fund construction of a water distribution and filtration system serving 5,000 people. In summary, we did good. Keller turned the meeting over to our own **Jorgen Holst**, who spoke about a purely Norwegian concept, Slow TV. What is the concept of Slow TV? Well, in our fast paced, hectic world, its something we all need right now. Slow TV is watching an ordinary event from beginning to end. The concept started with <u>Andy Warhol</u> in the 1960's, when he filmed his friend sleeping. In 1966, the concept of Slow TV hit the air waves of New York. Television station WPIX began airing the Christmas Yule Log, which quickly became an annual tradition. In the late 2000's, Norway's public broadcasting agency began airing Slow TV events. The first was a seven hour winter train ride, *Bergensbanen minute by minute – train journey across Southern Norway*, from Bergen to Oslo. The event became so popular with viewers, that they started airing more Slow TV shows, including a live broadcast of a 134-hour boat cruise, which experienced high viewership. People even gathered to welcome the ship into port.

Norwegian Slow TV events quickly gathered an international following, and became a great travel marketing tool. Slow TV events then started to move into non-travel events, such as the National Knitting Contest, and the National Choir singing every song from the Norwegian Song Book. Slow

TV, or Sakte-TV, became the word of the year in 2013. Currently, Norway Public Broadcasting is producing a cross-country bike ride. A search on YouTube will reveal thousands of SlowTV movies.



If the stress of the day is getting to you, a SlowTV movie is a perfect De-stressor.
