LETTER TO THE EDITOR



There will be a multitude new needs for assistance in our community as a result of the current virus crisis and these will become clearer as time goes on. However, one need that is clear and very close to home is the sudden and profound loss of business for local restaurants and caterers. Weddings and other celebrations have been cancelled and restaurants are closed except for takeout. Most of us are prudently staying home to slow the spread of the virus but this is devastating to the earnings of the restaurants and caterers and their employees.

One way our family is helping, is to donate to the Sebastopol Rotary Club Foundation. The Club Foundation is a 501 (c) 3 charity so donations are tax deductible and the dispersements are decided locally. We can designate how we want our donation to be used or we can leave it to the board to determine the best use for the donations. Our family has decided to donate at least the cost of our meals for the four Rotary meetings that will not be held at the usual Roto-Hall (Memorial Hall at the Sebastopol Community Church to many.) We

will designate that the donation be for the caterer who consistently provides yummy and reasonably priced lunchs for our meetings. Our small donation won't be much help to the caterer but if others in the club make a similar donation the assistance can be significant. We expect the board to contact our caterer to discuss her needs, and if for some reason a donation is not needed, that the donation be used to help another Sebastopol business suffering a severe loss of income.

Donations to the Sebastopol Rotary Club Foundation are now very easy. Simply go to the Club Webpage https://sebastopolrotary.com/, click on "Donate" in the Red Stripe near the top of the home page, and finally click the <image.png> button at the bottom of the page. This takes you to a PayPal site and the rest is pretty much like making any other online purchase (you don't need a PayPal account.) Except you can add a note about how you want the donation to be used, and there are no shipping costs. One minor irritation is you get a note the transaction is Pending for some reason, but it eventually goes through.
