Linda Irving, Sebastopol Union School District Superintendent and Park Side Principal, gave an update on the District's opening up after over a year of being closed. Learn With Me ceased on March 13. It will not open this school year, but could open with the fall semester. Child care and day care used Covid-19 funds to provide education and arts experience for an all day education. They partnered with Sebastopol Center for the Arts to provide the facility and the tools to provide the educational experience.

Linda went on to explain how they are providing in person education along with distance learning. There is an A Team and a B team. They are on campus on alternate days, distance learning on the other days. Also, partnering with the library, many books were distributed to students.

Dan Rasmus and **Fran** celebrated their anniversary out at Hog Island with friends. Their anniversary was April 11.




Next, **Dan** kidded **John Blount** about the number of controllers he uses (6). John added that what he really needs is a universal remote control.

Gene Nelson introduced our guest speaker, **Cordel Stillman**. **Gene** has known **Cordel** since he was 14. He is a local Sebastopol native. **Cordel** is one of the founding members of Sonoma Clean Power.



Sonoma Clean Power is a non-profit agency serving Sonoma and Mendocino counties. It generates electricity for approximately 227,000 customers. Sonoma Clean Power's mission is to provide higher levels of renewable energy and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. It helps solve the climate crisis at a local level. It reacts and responds to local needs and delivers benefits which make a difference for their customers.

Customer benefits include 1. electric car incentives (2016-2018); 2. Advanced Energy Rebuild (2017-present); 3. Electric Bike incentive for low income customers (in progress); 4. SGIP pre-payment for batteries (2020-present); 5. Transit electrification studies (completed); 6. Micro-grid studies at schools and municipal buildings (in progress); 7. Cal EVIP grant to install car chargers (in progress).

On the website you can get discounts on eligible improvements, apply for 0% on-bill financing, request bids from pre-qualified contractors, track your project's progress, review project invoices and permits as submitted by your contractor, and explore events. There are equipment discounts from Sonoma Clean Power for your project. There is also on-bill financing for home energy projects with no money down, 0% interest loans on up to \$10,000 and this is all billed on your electricity bill.

April 30, 2021 - Gravenstein Health Action Coalition and a Model for Self-Healing Communities - Sandra DeBella Bodley

Dr. Bodley is President of the Gravenstein Health Action Coalition. The Coalition is a collaboration of local organizations, agencies and individuals working together to support policy, system and environmental change to improve health outcomes of all residents of West County Sonoma.

Dr. Bodley formerly served on the Palm Drive Health Care District, elected in 2012 to a 4 year term serving as Secretary of the board and community services liaison. She was a Professor Emeritus in the Department of Nursing at Sonoma State University from 1975 to 2004, and served as Interim Director of the Santa Rosa Junior College ADN Program in 2003–2004.

Dr. Bodley received her B.S.N. from the University of San Francisco, her M.S.N. from California State University, San Jose, and her Ed.D. from the University of San Francisco. She lives in Sebastopol with her husband Walt Bodley.


On another note, Sebastopol Union students are returning to in-person learning this week. It is going well and everyone is so excited~! Thanks for your support of our students.
