

Aleia gave us the final rundown of the final team results. Coming in third place was the Overcoming Obstacles team with 225 tickets sold. Second place went to the Financial Literacy team, who won by a hair with 226 tickets sold. First place

went to the Youth Exchange team, who sold 299 tickets. Aleia thanked everyone who visited their neighbors and friends to sell raffle tickets. Dan turned the Roto-Spotlight on **Bob Rogers** who gave us an update on Polio Plus. **Bob** had two numbers for us: 98 and 124. 98 is the number of days since the Wild Polio virus was spotted in Pakistan. 124 is the number of days since the Wild Polio virus was spotted in Afghanistan. Those are the only two countries that have the Wild Polio virus, and since January 1st, there have only been two cases of Polio. Last year, there were 52 cases. We cannot stop here!
