To help honor and recognize the tremendous service that Military personal have provided for our country, **President Dan** has asked four fellow Sebastopol Rotarians relate some of their experiences with the Military. This was accompanied by a slideshow of Rotarian related photos. These photos are available After the Bell.

Laura Victor Van Gorder: At the time WWII broke out in 1942 Laura's uncle Norman was

teaching at a flight school and had a bombardiers, navigators and pilots license. The Army and the Air Force were together at that time. By 1943, the war was progressing to the point that we needed more fighter pilots over there. Norman died on his 25th birthday due to a severely damaged plane. Laura remembers him being a trickster and a whole lot of fun. She was only three years old when he died. Laura's husband was a Marine and was a bugle player in the Marine band. Laura still has her uncle's flight wings.



Robin Maybury: Robin Maybury arose to talk about his father Herbie. Herbie Maybury, Royal



Marine was in Kiel, Germany in WWII 1944. His platoon was there to surface the first nuclear submarine. The Nazis had scuppered it beneath 5 or 6 U-boats. Sadly in 2013, Herbie watched "Saving Private Ryan", which 69 years after Herbie's service resulted in him suffering a life threatening PTSD episode. Son **Robin** and Grandson Edward visited Kiel in 2018.

Greg Jacobs: Greg Jacobs's father was a dentist and was drafted in 1955 into the US Army Dental

Corps when **Greg** was only six years old. He served in Germany for two years, and the family lived in Augsburg. Being during the cold war, **Greg** had many interesting experiences. Augsburg was down by Munich near the Bavarian Alps.. Since it was just 10 years since the end of WWII, there was still a lot of remnants of the war. There were former German soldiers on the street corner playing the accordion. The family took a trip to Dachau prison and it was still in the same state as it was when the prison was closed down. Greg is not a holocaust denier. **Greg** did learn a lot about the effects of war has on people and countries.



Keller McDonald: Both Marcia McDonald's (Keller's wife) father Harry Stevenson and Uncle William Stevenson attended the United States Naval Academy in the early 1930's, and both went on to become submarine skippers during WWII. After serving in the South Pacific for a couple of years Marcia's father developed an eye disease that made it impossible for him to see through the periscope so he stepped away from submarine command. After that an amazing thing happened, the

Navy asked <u>Harry</u> to nominate a successor to his ship and he nominated <u>Bill Stevenson</u>, his younger brother. Both <u>Harry</u> and <u>Bill</u> had distinguished careers in the Navy. <u>Harry</u> retired as a Rear Admiral and <u>Bill</u> as a Captain. **Keller** feels that having <u>Harry</u> and <u>Bill</u> as family members had a definite effect on their two sons since both of them attended the Naval Academy. **Keller** mentioned that son <u>Luke</u> and his wife <u>Vicky</u>, Navy Doctors in San Diego, recently delivered **Keller's** eighth grandchild, a boy. Looks like another potential Admiral in the family.

Pam Graber took the mic to introduce today's program Mitcho Thompson, the current Vice President of Sonoma County Herb Association. He is a founding board member and former Community Liason for Peace in Medicine in Sonoma County. And he is the Chancellor Emeritus of Oaksterdam University's former North Bay Campus. Mitcho owns a CCOF farm in South Sebastopol with a large garden where he grows certified organic medicinal herbs, hosts workshops and teaches volunteers from Sonoma County Herb Exchange. He also illustrated the amazing book by Leslie Gardener on growing medicinal herbs, "Life in Medicine".



His new business "Phytomagic, located in downtown at the Resourcery, will focus on the manufacturing of CannaCentric Herbal Products of all sorts. Sara Shrader of the organization Americans for safe access says "Mitcho is the Martha Stewart of our industry and one of the most knowledgeable people about the synergy of herbs.


Mitcho Thompson, who introduced Resourcery to Sebastopol took the mic and spoke about cannabis

and the many factors that may influence how it affects users. During this amazing presentation, Micho shared a little bit of history and botany. Then he went in on to discuss terpenes and cannabinoids. He also pointed out how the harvesting and processing shapes the way the cannabis will be felt—such as heat processing versus cold processed cannabis products. Then Mitcho gave us an overview of the three methods with which we ingest – the lungs—the digestive tract and the skin. He also pointed out the various forms of cannabis products such as smoking or vapor pens, topical oils and edibles. Another workday has been scheduled for November 2020. 2) **Mete Senocak** – Home for Homeless Committee – First online meeting held Thursday, November 5, 2020. **Mete** gave a PowerPoint presentation, and the team discussed the three stages of the current plan, and then discussed perspectives and ideas. With that, we officially started the first stage which is the "idea stage" where we will try to understand the causes of homelessness and, also, look into possible solutions.
