



Jim Pacatte introduced today's speaker: <u>Jeremy Hurst</u>, property developer, from Grand Cayman Islands. Jeremy was born and raised in Rochester, England in 1961 and relocated to the Cayman



Islands in 1988 on an 18-month contract and 32 years later still calls Cayman home. <u>Jeremy</u> owns and operates the IRG group of companies offering property and investment-related services to private investors and corporations in the Cayman Islands and is active in promoting investment into the Caribbean Region. He is also a property developer, Chair of the Global Board of Leading Real Estate Companies of the World and sits on the board of an international private bank. He joined the Rotary Club of Grand Cayman in 1988 and seven years later became its youngest President. He has held numerous other district positions was a member Rotary International's Membership Committee from 2015 to 2017.

He chairs HANWASH's steering committee with the ambitious goal of bringing clean water, good sanitation and hygiene to all the citizens of Haiti. He is currently the General Chair of the Zone 33 and 34 Pittsburgh Summit to be held virtually in November this year. Jeremy is a recipient of The Rotary Foundation Citation for Meritorious Service and Michelle and Jeremy are Major Donors and Bequest Society members. They are also strong supporters of Interact and Rotaract and transitioning young professionals into Rotary. Together they have four children, love travelling, (even if virtually) and making the most of the unique opportunities to serve, build lifelong friendships and fellowship that Rotary brings to their lives.

Jeremy's speech on *HANWASH: Haiti National Clean Water and Health Strategy* was interesting and compelling. There are 11 million people in Haiti, half of them without clean water or sanitation. They have not recovered from the 2010 earthquake despite the billions that have been put into their recovery.





cent a gallon but must be paid for.

HANWASH is a part of a larger group of seven bringing clean water and sanitation to the many communes in Haiti. They include many different service and government groups. What was striking about this group was the fact it is based on a business model rather than a donation. Move past the idea of relief and embrace the concept of development. The amount charged helps maintain the water supply and helps invest the users in a sense of owning the supply. The water costs less than 1

Currently everyone buys water in the ubiquitous 16 oz plastic bottles. It was reported that these bottles line the highways almost as tall as the cars on the road. The *HANWASH* project provides water from spigots and can fill a five-gallon jug. They are going to be located in each commune often saving 44 minute walk to obtain fresh water and an hour return.

This will take 25 years and 2-3 billion dollars. HANWASH provides a business based best practices. They help develop a community action



plan. Rotary members of Haiti provide on the ground assessment.

HANWASH is looking for other Rotary Districts to help with the project.
