



THE PROGRAM






Rachel Averbuck shared her reflections from her two year visit to India as a Rotary Ambassadorial Scholar in 1997-99 and the impact it had on her life.

The first thing that struck me about <u>Rachel's</u> program was how soon technology makes old familiar objects & tools obsolete. <u>Rachel's</u> program was delivered with a trusty Kodak Carousel projector with old fashioned slides. My how times change and things disappear! Rachel received a \$10,000 Rotary ambassadorial scholarship which was supposed to last her for one year in India. She stretched that money out to stay 2 years. She had many great images and stories. I was struck by the magnitude of the people in all of her images. <u>Rachel</u> says India is a place where people can be alone together. Her images were beautiful. It's too bad they were hard to see with the competing ambient light.

Two of <u>Rachel's</u> questions stick with me. What makes a place sacred? Answer: people. How do we send out our hopes? Referring to prayers flags. <u>Rachel</u> continued with slides & stories until the slide tray was empty. There were questions & answers all perfectly timed to end the presentation at 1:28 pm giving **President Ellen** enough time to give this week's pondering.

COMMUNITY VOLUNTEER PROJECTS (Cindy Carter, Diana Rich, Co-Chairs)

A) Friday, March 18, 2022, from 9 to 11:30am the Sebastopol Rotary Clubs worked alongside the <u>Ceres</u> <u>Community Garden's</u> master gardeners to plant trees that our club had donated through our Community Grants

program. Stop by the garden's <u>new location on the Sebastopol Independent Charter school's property</u> to enjoy the new 1.5-acre location and look for the new fruit trees along the right-hand fence line. We also donated shrubs which are planned for the northern fence line and should be planted soon.

- B) Sunday, April 3, 2022, from 9-11:30am the work on the Sebastopol Post Office Landscape Project was continued. The Rotary Club of Sebastopol installed the landscaping around the Post Office during **Mike Long's** Rotary year (2007-2008). Currently, it was in need of a lot of TLC. In March we weeded, pruned & spread wood chips to beautify the Post Office. On April 3rd, **John and Patti Blount** joined the crew to continue the work. There is still additional mulch that needs to be spread (apparently five feet of depth is best, and we are only at three feet). Stay tuned for one more workday on this project. Dan Needham, the Community Services Chair for the morning club has been leading the fun.
- C) Saturday, April 9, 2022, was the second <u>Helping Other People</u> (HOP) workday. This is a program run by the <u>Sebastopol Area Senior Center</u>, which invited seniors who have small projects they cannot do themselves to submit requests to the Center for help. The <u>Sebastopol Service and Action Coalition</u>, of which we are a part, volunteered to respond to as many of the requests as possible. The projects included: landscape/cleanup work, hanging pictures, replacing a toilet, replacing a kitchen faucet, and clearing down spouts/cobwebs.
- D) Saturday, April 16, 2022, at 9am <u>High School Road Trash Pickup</u>. Let's honor our town and the memory of <u>Big Lou Hopfer</u>. We'll be done in a couple of hours with enough volunteers! Meet in the north-most parking lot at the high school. Hosted by <u>Dan Needham</u>, Sebastopol Sunrise Rotary Club.
- E) <u>Redwood Empire Food Bank</u> (REFB) Workday the next joint workday with the sunrise club is scheduled for Wednesday, April 27, 2022, from 2-4pm.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT (**Hal Kwalwasser**, Chair) – Robin's report on the website notes that the Out of Africa information is on the site, as is the Teacher of the Year application. I will try to do the "year end" update of the site over the next few weeks. If I can't get to it, we'll have to leave it to the new editor post-July 1.

The <u>Community Needs Summit</u> is proceeding nicely. The site is West County High School Cafeteria, June 14 at 4:30-7pm. We have approximately 12 volunteers to do the work (from our club, Sunrise, Lions and Kiwanis). The City has voted to support our effort, authorize use of their mailing lists and appropriated \$1,000 to help defray costs (Most of their money is likely to go to an insert in next month's water bills promoting the event.). Our letter to providers asking them to submit a form with their updated volunteer opportunities information will go out this week. That will be followed by calls from our volunteers to make sure they've gotten the mail and to encourage them to participate once again this year.

Related to the Summit: The City is holding a celebration of its 120th anniversary in Ives Park on Saturday, June 18. The organizers reached out to us to see if we wanted to hold the Summit in the morning of June 18 before their festivities. Their idea was that they, too, are promoting volunteerism, so there would be synergy between the two. The collective judgment of the Sebastopol Service and Action Coalition members is that the two programs clash more than mutually support one another. However, we will do what we can to promote the week of June 12 as "Volunteer Week," which should be of some benefit to promoting the Summit.

The Apple Blossom Float is coming along nicely. It will promote the Summit with large banners on each side of **Guenter's** truck (the same one that we used last fall). We have a place to build the float, volunteers, banner designs and a commitment to cover the cost of wood and other materials. Also, several of our "superheroes," who

walked alongside the truck last fall have agreed to don their costumes again to carry through on the fall theme of "Superheroes Volunteer."
