AT THE BELL





Raffle ticket sales are picking up, but are still available – The final push is on!








THE PROGRAM

full time equivalent employees. He went on to explain the mission of the detention division and its goals in support of the mission. He gave a history of the Main Adult Detention Facility. (M.A.D.F.) It was opened in

1991. This as a new generation facility based on a direct supervision design. It held 500 inmates. It guickly was expanded to hold 912 in 1997. There is a second facility for minimum security inmates at the airport. It opened in 1967. 49% of the inmates have mental health issues. 40% have substance abuse issues and 18% are gang members. There are several inmate programs including anger management, horticulture, and a high school GED program.
