THE WHEEL OF MISFORTUNE



As is customary, **President Ellen** asked our guest speaker Dr Margaret Press to pick a number at random to select who would make the spin. Like Jimmy Garrapolo taking it in on a quarterback sneak – She called her own number. That's right. Of all the numbers she could have picked, she picked her own. **Amee Sas** was sitting right next to her and vouched for the fairness of the pick.



When the shock wore off, she gamely spun the wheel and won \$5 bucks. How lucky can you get?

THE PROGRAM

Amee Sas introduced our guest speaker Dr. Margaret Press. Dr Press lives locally but heads an organization, *the DNA Doe Project*, that is national in scope. In short, the Project attempts to identify deceased John/Jane Does in order to bring peace to families and possibly justice to doers of evil.



There are thousands of unidentified bodies in this country. Medical Examiners in various jurisdictions are sometimes completely unable to identify remains. After researching DNA banks, fingerprints and other indices, the Examiners simply come up short. And in most cases there are families somewhere who are unable to bring closure to the fact of a lost loved one.

Dr Press pointed out that in recent times a small industry has sprung up wherein a person can send his or her DNA to a private company. That company, such as 23 and me or Ancestry, processes the DNA and extracts that tiny percentage that makes you you. Most DNA is identical among humans. There is a small portion that is unique. That small portion is actually shared in some ways with your relatives. The closer the relative the more CMs or centimorgans you share. There is now a huge bank of processed DNA held by these companies.

Dr Press determined that the DNA of a John/Jane Doe could be compared with this huge bank to determine who the relatives are and make identification possible. Alas, the big companies said NIX – you are not getting to look in the bank. But....there is a third party bank called GEDMatch where individuals can put their individual information as supplied by the companies. Dr Press and Project can access this bank. Although it is small in comparison to the big companies, Dr Press and her group of volunteers have been able to use the information in GEDMatch to start a family tree. DNA from the John Doe can match someone, perhaps a distant relative in GEDmatch. The Project then constructs a family tree through slow painstaking research among various ancestry data banks.



The first success was when an unidentified young woman was matched to a cousin. The Project found that the young woman's father had done his own family tree and noted that one daughter was "missing, presumed dead." The Project notified law enforcement who then contacted the father and, sad as it may seem, closed the loop.

The Project is a non-profit and staffed by volunteers. The costs are low but the DNA has to be recovered and it can be a difficult process. Over 70 unidentified individuals have been successfully identified by the DNA Doe Project. In some cases, law enforcement was only waiting for positive identification to go after perpetrators.



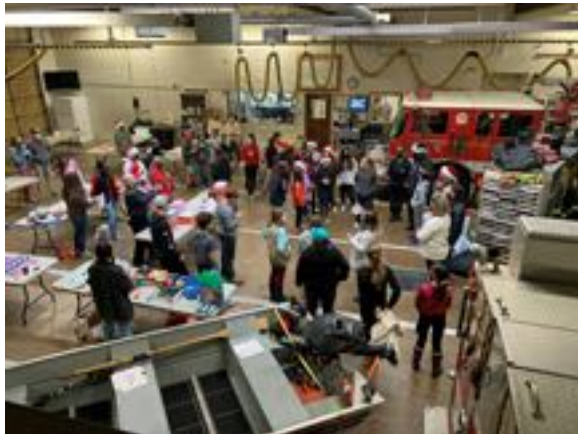
