AN UPDATE ON WEST COUNTY HIGH SCHOOL - TONI BEAL





Toni Beal took the lectern to update the Club on the West County High School District. The High School District does not have enough students to maintain two High Schools and a Continuation School. Hence the recent merger of El Molino High and Analy High. The new High School dubbed West County High School has 1530 students attending classes at the old Analy High Campus. 87 Laguna High students attend at the old El Molino campus.

It was recently decided by the School Board that West County High will become Analy High starting in the 2022-2023 school year. Most activities at the El Molino campus will be phased out with the exception of Laguna. Some facilities will still be used and others subject to being rented out to the community.

Toni said that the District has received some recent grants to enhance CTE studies and improve the interactions and relationship with Santa Rosa Junior College. She asked for any help the club could provide with guest speakers, mentors or paid internships.

THE PROGRAM





The most important thing is to find the mailbox that says 3555 Thorn Road, before getting off to the small lane.




