


Cindy Carter had a Rotary Anniversary.


## THE PROGRAM



**Mike Ferguson** introduced our Speaker <u>Joel Bartlett</u>. You don't have to be an old timer to remember Joel Bartlett Weatherman Extraordinaire on Channel 5 and 7 but it helps. <u>Joel</u> always brought humor and wit to his forecasts. How he got there is interesting too.

Joel began by excusing himself and taking a quick walk outside where he looked up at the sky. He immediately returned and reported that it was a very nice day out. Even though he retired in 2006, old habits die hard apparently.

<u>Joel</u> studied engineering in college. When he joined the Air Force his aptitude test got him into weather school. He loved it. It took a year to learn weather for the military and he enjoyed hanging out in Texas, wearing the uniform, and the whole science of weather. When he mustered out, he found a job with Pacific Gas and Electric in his field of weather forecasting, here in the Bay Area.





<u>Joel</u> enjoyed his time at PGE. One of his hobbies was sailing and he and a friend spent hours on the Bay in a 26 foot Thunderbird sloop. One evening a surprise storm ran them on the rocks and broke the boat in half. An alert newsman from the Examiner got the photos, interviewed the shipwrecked <u>Joel</u> and came out with the front page story. *Weatherman and Insurance adjuster surprised by storm – wreck ship.* 

This rather embarrassing circumstance ended up getting <u>Joel</u> invited to speak at a couple of yacht clubs. At the Tiburon club, he was approached by an executive from Channel 5 who offered him an audition as on-air weatherman. <u>Joel</u> took the chance, aced the audition, and became a nightly fixture in Bay Area homes for years to come.

<u>Joel</u> described the nightly weather segment from back in the day. Each channel got the same satellite printout about 1pm. By the five o'clock news, the weatherman was reporting what might happen. By the eleven o'clock news, he was reporting what had happened. The idea of a three-day forecast was unheard of – a seven day? You were just guessing.

Joel finished his presentation with a lively question and answer session with the group.
