July 8, 2022 - John Namkung - A Journey to the Poland/Ukraine Border to Assist Ukrainian Refugees

In April, John Namkung traveled to Poland, rented a van and made multiple trips into Ukraine to help families flee. Namkung put 5,500 miles on his rental van in two weeks. In Poland, at a Ukrainian refugee camp, John witnessed suffering by ordinary people forced into harrowing escape, and the same instinct among parents to do anything possible to protect their children. In contrast to the Syrian refugee camp he visited in Greece, 90% of the Ukrainian refugees were women or children.

July 15, 2022 - Donald Laird - Head of Computer Science Department at SRJC - Taking Flight: The World of Drones

Donald Laird's jovial, positive energy fills his computer science classes; he can transform a room within his first two sentences. And his constant curiosity helps keep the department he chairs in tune with the latest trends in technology. He'll entertain and educate us on exciting drone technology.

July 24, 2022 - C. Jane Taylor - Spirit Traffic

Spirit Traffic recounts how, at the age of 50, the author learned to ride a motorcycle, overcame the terror of navigating her steep dirt driveway in Vermont, and, three days after her son's college graduation, set off with him and her yoga-teacher husband (his stepdad) on a 10,000-mile two-wheel adventure that took them all into uncharted territory—both as novice riders, and as a family.

(Expenses: We have \$500 budgeted for signage for Community Grants yet for 2021-22. **Jack Dunlap** is working on that aspect and I don't believe we have even ordered them yet nor have a final amount.)

Future REFB workdays will continue to be "joint" workdays with the Sebastopol Sunrise Club. (Expenses: **Robin** and I never heard back from Cloverleaf Ranch regarding their disability ramp design. HOMELESSNESS (**Jack Dunlap**, Chair) – The Homeless committee had a plan to meet with the representatives of the Sunshine Village along with members of the Sunrise Rotary to learn about what projects the Rotary Clubs can undertake to help improve living conditions at the village. (Having a safe place to park is a major step toward moving folks from unsheltered to long term sheltered status but it is not all that is needed. Many need help with mental and physical health issues including drug and alcohol abuse and assistance with getting employment and housing vouchers. Improving living conditions and reducing the operating costs of the village help meet these additional support needs.) Unfortunately, the meeting had to be cancelled due to an outbreak of COVID in the village. We hope to be able to reschedule in the not too distant future.

LEARN TO SWIM (**Greg Jacobs**, **Rick Wilson**, Co-Chairs) – Learn to Swim (LTS) wrap-up: 157 students enjoyed eight half hour lessons from April 25 to May 19. Each student received a swim bag, t-shirt, and certificate of completion. The lessons were extremely well received. The teachers and schools were especially pleased to have this opportunity available for this year's second graders. 94 volunteers signed up and the class sizes were relatively small; providing students with an opportunity to receive plenty of guidance. Each volunteer instructor received a t-shirt and a thank you email. The LTS committee is already starting to look into ways to improve the program for next year (tentatively scheduled for Apr 17 to May 12, 2023). (Expenses: One last expense is \$150 gift certificate to Willow Wood restaurant for **Cindy Carter**. She took on a huge task of organizing the permission slips and volunteer data base and saved us at least \$1,500. I was going to take care of it but got COVID last week. I will do it and submit later. **Ken Jacobs** said okay.

Brookhaven - At the last meetings there were 8 eighth grade students present. **Pauline** asked them how many joined Interact as 5th graders. Six raised their hands. Most all were officers this year. **Pauline** also asked which projects were their favorites. Again, they enjoyed the Adopt-a-Family project the most. Students talked about how they learned about being an officer, how to make motions and about honoring their commitments. Brook Haven School is wonderful about letting Interact have fundraisers on campus. This year they raised a total of \$1,500 which includes the \$400 from working to assemble the Crab Feed boxes. They voted to donate \$300 each to the following charities-Sierra Club, Ant Hill Foundation, Children of Ukraine, American Cancer Society, and Canine Companions.

Twin Hills - Each club has their own dynamics. Twin Hills had a more difficult year for some reason. The principal thought it was because of COVID. The new principal loves the Interact program and is offering to make it one of her priorities for the next school year. Twin Hills raised \$700, \$400 from assembling the Crab Feed boxes and \$300 selling lollipops. They spent an entire meeting selecting their charities. Lots of opinionated Interactors! Their final decision is a tear jerker! They voted to give \$350 to Dogma Dog Rescue project and \$350 to the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society in the name of the new Twin Hills superintendent, Ana Guzman, who has battled Lymphoma this year. Very touching!!! Such caring students.

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE – DOROTHY RODELLA, DIRECTOR:

ROTARY INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION – (**Lu Frazier** – Chair) – Foundation Report as of 5/30/2022 for our Club # 413 has us with 98 members. Annual Fund for the Month \$110 (Reportedly this includes \$40,000 raised for Ukraine (need to confirm this.) YTD \$50,070 against a club goal of \$20,000. “Other” includes Polio Plus for the Month \$40. YTD \$57,739 against a club goal of \$10,000. Total raised this year for the Rotary Foundation is \$107,809. We are # 1 in the District by \$5 (Santa Rosa East/West with a \$85k endowment donation which represented 78% of their total donations for the year.)

WORLD COMMUNITY SERVICE – (**Keller McDonald** – Chair) - Total approved budget \$11,200. Projects funded \$10,200.

Project Hope Corp Street Business School \$1,000 -- We allocated \$1,000 to help support the initial \$6,800 to pilot this project. **Steve Beck** is our point person on this project. **Steve** is out of town for an extended trip. **Kelly** will contact him and provide us with an update.

Steve Prandini, our contact point person with Chidamoyo Hospital, received an email from Major Mareki (hospital admin) saying the baby incubator (\$7,200) arrived just in time to be utilized to help 2 premature babies! No mention of whether the memorial plaque for Kathy McCarthy arrived, but **Steve** will check. We will share this info with club asap.

Observations: We did good work without international budget this year. Several club members changed my belief that our club would benefit greatly from getting involved in a hands-on international project, where we see our world service dollars at work. We will be hunting for that type of project in the next Rotary year.
