THE PROGRAM



Our very own **Frank Mayhew** Stepped up to the mic to introduce our speaker for the day, **Brian Bauer**. **Brian** is a member of the Sunrise Club and founder and CEO of Recynergi, a recycling company. **Frank** got involved with **Brian** several years ago by providing funds for **Brian** to start Recynergi.

Brian mentioned that Recynergi takes waste plastics that are not recycled and converts them into a diesel fuel and gasoline type output that can be used to make plastic again. Their core difference in the market is they use microwave for heating in the process called pyrolysis whereas traditional plastics to fuel operation use coal, propane or wood for heating. These traditional systems are inefficient from a heating stand point, but with microwaves they can provide targeted heating within the reactor to be much more efficient. Just like at home, where the food is the only thing that gets hot so it is with their core. As it gets hotter at the center of the microwave reactor, they mechanically mix

in plastic chips which are converted into gas, then condensed into liquid products. Using their system they can process 10% faster than with more traditional heating approaches. This translates into their ability to utilize a relatively small reactor as part of compact modular system that is about the size of a shipping container, which is a great advantage versus having to construct a giant plant.

ROTARY INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION – (Lu Frazier – Chair) -- Foundation Report as of 4/11/2022 for our Club # 413 has us with 98 members.

Annual Fund for the Month \$40,525 (includes \$30,000 raised for Ukraine.) YTD \$65,920 against a club goal of \$20,000.

Polio Plus for the Month \$140 YTD \$57,009 against a club goal of \$10,000.

Total raised this year for the Rotary Foundation is \$122,929.

Rotary Sebastopol raised over \$40,000 in March for the Ukraine. \$10,000 came from the Board (Thanks for it being approved 100% by the Board.) The other \$30,000 came from 16 members.

Rotary Sebastopol had three new major donors in March and April. Looking forward to presenting the awards, hopefully in April or early May.

WORLD COMMUNITY SERVICE – (Keller McDonald – Chair) - Total approved budget \$11,200. Projects funded \$10,200

1) Baby Incubator for Chidamoyo Hospital - \$7,200 - Funds have been donated for the incubator and a thank you letter received (attached). **Steve Prandini** had a plaque made in Petaluma in memory of Kathy McCarty, which our club paid for from the budget for this project. The plaque has been mailed to Major at Chidamoyo Hospital.

2) Harare Well project - \$1,500 - John Muhliner at the St. Helena club has acknowledged receipt of our \$1,500 to support their Harare water project. The project now has full funding to be completed by end of summer.

3) Puerto Vallarta Water Filter project \$1,500 - Jose Guillen from Santa Rosa club has acknowledged receipt of \$1,500 from our club plus an additional \$125 donation for this project from one of our club members. This project has provided over 1,100 water filters to date.
