TRIBUTE TO VETERANS – THE AUDIE MURPHY STORY



Mike Ferguson took the lectern to present a short talk honoring veterans. He chose as his subject Audie Murphy. Many of the older generation know the name but might not be clear on the story. Few in the younger generation even know the name.

Audie Murphy was the most decorated soldier in World War 2. He was rejected for military service as a young man in Texas for being too

small and too young. Not deterred, his sister forged a birth certificate and he was inducted as age 16.

Deployed to the Italian Front at the beginning of the war, he covered himself with glory through several bloody battles. At one point, his friend approached two enemy soldiers who were pretending to surrender. When the enemy killed his friend, he took over and almost single handedly took the entrenched position killing several and taking eleven prisoners. His exploits led to the Silver Star, Purple Heart, Bronze Star and the Congressional Medal of Honor. Also a battlefield commission. All as a teenader.

Audie Murphy went on to a career as a Hollywood film star making several westerns and an autobiographical film about his time in the War. His story is like none other and we appreciate **Mike** for bringing it to us.

Robin Maybury introduced guest speaker Shugri Salh. Shugri is a resident of Sonoma County, married with three children and a career in the medical field. She is also "The Last Nomad," the title of her recently published memoir.

Shugri told the fascinating tale of life in Somalia. Her grandmother was a nomadic goat herder in the desert of Somalia. Her mother was taken to the city by her father who was urban and educated. He also fathered 23 children. When Shugri finished first grade, her grandmother was struggling in the desert so her mother decided to send Shugri to live and work with grandmother as a nomad.

She spoke wistfully of life in the desert – its beauty and challenge. She said she didn't know any better and felt she was living a

wonderful life. She learned at her grandmother's feet, reciting poetry in the Somali language. Lions, warthogs, goats - all part of everyday life.

Shugri's mother passed away when she was a teenager. She returned to the city



from the desert. She remembered her teenage years as rambunctious, spending time thinking about boys and the beautiful white sand beaches of Somalia. Unfortunately violence soon became endemic in Mogadishu and her innocent teenage years became punctuated with gunfire.

As Somalia slipped into chaos, her family decided to go. Becoming a refugee is hard at any age but for a teenager extremely traumatic. The family walked. She said that she didn't even know that countries in Africa had borders.



They eventually found safety in a refugee camp at the Kenya border and soon got to Nairobi. Through what she termed good luck, she was able to resettle in Canada, and eventually to immigrate to America with her husband.

This inspiring story is fully told in the book "The Last Nomad." She left us with a reading from the prologue. She also read us a poem and translation from her late brother.

December 3, 2021 - Kent Porter - Stories from a local Photojournalist



At the Press Democrat, Kent Porter has covered numerous Super Bowls and World Series events, traveled to Cuba, Canada and Mexico with 45 different states in between for coverage of one type or another. He spent a week on the Prince William Sound in a fishing boat, documenting the aftermath of the Exxon Valdez oil spill and another two-weeks in airplanes, helicopters and automobile, photographing the extent of the economic damage in Valdez, Anchorage and Cordova. He covered the Loma Prieta earthquake from the get-go, on the field at Candlestick Park and eventually at the Bay Bridge. He masterfully covered the past six years of calamitous wildfires, whiplash flooding and drought.

Kent has won international, national and state awards, and was also on the 2018 Pulitzer Prize team for the PD's coverage of the 2017 fires that burned our communities. He's a big believer in newspapers and journalism as a whole, passionate

about community communication and using all channels available to tell stories in our region.
