Past President Dan got up to introduce today's speaker, <u>Dr Charles Evans</u>. <u>Dr Evans</u> recently returned from a 160 mile walk across the Great Riff Valley in Kenya to raise funds for an orphanage in Ethiopia. He shared stories and pictures from the journey. We also learned about what drives this highly respected Sonoma County Doctor to have participated in numerous

vaccination campaigns in South America. <u>Dr Evans</u> has been an ER Doctor in Sonoma County for the past 35 years. Outside of work, his passion seems to be in helping the needy. In the 1970's he volunteered by walking village to

village in South America vaccinating young children for polio, smallpox and measles.

<u>Dr Evans</u> showed us pictures and told stories of the 2019 walk as well as the walk he was on last month. Each day before they resumed the walk they shared a story of one of the orphans to inspire them for the day. In addition to thirty camels to carry the gear they had a team of local Masai and other locals to assist them with

the walk. They experienced the beauty of Africa, including the sunrises, sunsets, evening rains, giraffes, elephants and other wonderful creatures while walking to support the orphanages. As they passed the villages, the locals were intrigued by their white skin but totally enthralled with the camels. At the end of the walk the children at the orphanage were given camel rides until they did not want anymore.

An interesting side note: <u>Dr Evans</u> shared that he also spent 5 days working at the clinic last month. The Covid case rate is 20% in the area, but the symptoms were far less severe than what we see here.

HOMELESSNESS (**Jack Dunlap**, Chair) - The Homeless Committee is meeting [met] on Wednesday. One item on our agenda is whether to ask the club to help finance a water station to serve the ad hoc homeless community on Morris Street. This is a group of RVs that park along the street across from the Barlow and towards the Community Center. The City of Sebastopol has provided Porta Potties and a wash station and is overlooking the 72-hour parking requirement. The RVs must be registered and meet minimal health and safety requirements. What the group is missing is a source of

potable water they can use for cooking and washing. The City of Sebastopol has identified a drinking water station with a list price of \$6,100 which is similar to units installed elsewhere in Sebastopol.

A question is if the club would be willing to consider a donation that would cover around 1/3 of the cost, or a little over \$2,000? If there is at least a reasonable probability this can be funded, and the committee agrees this is a worthwhile expenditure we will begin discussions with the Sunrise Rotary, West County Community Services, and the City to move this project forward.
