


Jeff Boal gave a review of the restaurant, *Hole in the Wall*. He said above all, they know what service is, and the food is great. He also gave a shout out to **Mario**'s restaurant, *Mexico Lindo*.

Kathy Hicks introduced Bret McIntyre. They both work at EBA Engineering. Kathy is a civil engineer and Bret is an engineering geologist. EBA Engineering is a multi-discipline firm that covers Environmental, Residential, Commercial. Municipal, Landfill, Industrial, Multi-Family, Water Resources, Energy & Utilities.

Bret gave a guick overview of how he came to be a geologist.



- Kinder to 5th grade Rocks, dinosaurs, and space. 6th Grade to 12th Grade Marine Biologist or bust!

- 12th Grade Busted, joined the Army. 1995 Graduated UCSB with a B.S. in Geosciences.
- The next ten years OSHA Hazwoper, nuclear gauge, concrete/grout sampling, soils laboratory, shoe-shining.
- Then, in 2005 Professional Geologist license and the title, "Staff Geologist".
- Three years later, in 2008 Engineering Geologist license and the title, "Project Manager".
- Five years later, in 2013, became a Qualified SWPPP Developer and inherited much more complicated projects.
- In the next 9 years, worked in various roles, including a 6-1/2 year stint with Sonoma County Transportation & Public Works as the County's "Drainage Guy".
- Now a "Senior Engineering Geologist" with EBA Engineering, working on miscellaneous geotechnical, water resources, and erosion control projects in the public, industrial, and private sectors.

He explained that typical geotech-centric engineering geology projects usually involve residential, commercial/industrial or governmental. That means everything from retaining walls to reservoirs to bridges. He then explained the entire engineering process from original contract to permits to finished report.



President Hal reminded us that we will not be meeting at the Church Hall on August 12 but instead will gather at Georgetown, home of Guy and Michelle Smith for an off-site meeting.
