Ruthie Dunlap introduced our guest speakers from Sebastopol World Friends (SWF). Their motto is World Peace, One Friend at a Time.



First to take the lectern was <u>Beth Lamb. Beth</u> is a retired hydrogeologist who is Board Chair. She explained that Sebastopol World Friends has been active since 1988 most visibly though the Sebastopol Sister City program. Sebastopol has two sister cities about the same size as Sebastopol. Takeo City is in southern Japan. SWF has sponsored student exchanges over the years including an exchange of middle school students. Although exchanges have been on hold since 2020 (Thanks a lot, Covid) there is much hope that they will commence, possibly as soon as July.

The other sister city is Chyhyryn Ukraine. Chyhyryn is presently outside of the fighting and destruction of the Russian Invasion but is nonetheless in crisis. With the help of **Jack Dunlap** and **Tom Boag** the SWF was able to have Zoom meetings with international participation. They also hosted a dinner in 2020 to raise funds.

The second speaker was <u>Patricia Deignan</u>. As chair of the Chyhyryn Committee she has made a trip to Poland to deliver much needed supplies. She was awarded Sebastopol Humanitarian of the Year. As the invasion of Ukraine appeared imminent last January, she organized Analy students and others in a peace flag project and a fundraiser. She facilitated the delivery of hundreds of pairs of shoes from our own **Myriah Volk**.





The final speaker was <u>Steve Levenberg</u>. <u>Steve explained the</u> current project of Sebastopol World Friends. SWF asked the sister city what was needed most. The answer was assistance with the building of Invincibility Centers. The city of Chyhyryn is requesting funds to provide electricity and WiFi for residents. 



We are reserving \$1,000 from our budget last year, earmarked for the <u>Village HopeCorps "Street Business School" project in Kenya</u>. We are awaiting a <u>global grant application</u> now in process through the <u>Rotary Club of Phoenix</u>. **Steve Beck** is shepherding this project.

Frank Mayhew is in contact with the <u>Ant Hill Foundation</u>, which is working on a global grant to build a vocational school in <u>Uganda</u>. **Frank** is also in contact with the <u>Lira Rotary Club in Uganda</u>, which is interested in another global grant for another <u>Keeping Girls in School</u> project.

Reports are that the <u>Ukrainian</u> family we're helping support through the <u>Lone Pine Ukrainian Family Aid</u> project seems to be settling in nicely. Several other Ukrainian families have moved to Sonoma County (Sebastopol, Santa Rosa, Healdsburg, and Cloverdale.) We look forward to establishing friendships and connections between our club and this family.

Keller McDonald will contact <u>District 5130 leaders</u> to learn more about how district contributions to support global grants and club grants are managed and how District 5130 has built up significant funds in this account. **Keller** will report to committee in near future.
