#### THE PROGRAM - OUT OF AFRICA





Just a mere few years ago, a seventeen-year-old student named **David** dared to dream. He made a list of his life goals, which he still has by the way. We aren't sure if becoming a Rotary President was on that list, but what was on that list was someday, sometime, taking a trip to Africa and getting up close and personal with its fabulous wildlife. And, thanks to Rotary, he and wife, **Carolee**, were finally able to go.

Return to January 25, 2020, Sebastopol's Tropical Escape fund-raiser. One live auction item was a dream trip - a South Africa Safari – nine days and eight nights for two. Here was the opportunity. **David** made his bid...and he won! Who says dreams don't come true? Of course, because of the pandemic, the journey was delayed almost three years.

But finally they departed in August, 2022, on a 39 hour journey to a lodge in South Africa, a place with great food, great accommodations. Highlights included a pet hippo - Jessica! Nothing like sharing afternoon tea with an animal that weighs one and a half tons!



It was the African spring, so temperatures were moderate, and mosquitos were not a problem. There were a number of animals at the lodge, and many were people friendly.

On some of the many outings, **David** made friends with a lion cub and fed elephants.





The inhabitants at a nearby crocodile farm were perhaps not so friendly, but since they have been around since the dinosaurs, they don't have to answer to anyone. A croc can actually go three years without eating. But it is advised not to be anywhere near one at the beginning of that 4th year!

We have our majestic sequoias, if we don't' burn them all down, but Africa has its Baobab trees, some of which are over 2000 years old and gigantic.

The main feature of the tour was Kruger National Park, an immense nature and animal preserve. This is the place to go to view natural Africa at its best, with a wonderful variety of animals and birds, many of whom, such as



Rhinos, are endangered. The scenery isn't too shabby either. David shared wonderful photos of wildlife, the highlight of which was a great view of a leopard. Wild dogs are cute, but it is

probably not a good idea to try to pet one. They are among the best hunters in Africa. He also showed us a Rhino without a horn. Horns are removed from young rhinos to discourage poachers who kill these magnificent beasts for their horns.



Time Out! **President Hal** stepped up to announce the program was running past 1:30 but will continue. Those who have schedules to keep are free to go. Now on with the show!

**David** reported that poaching is way down everywhere in South Africa, one reason being that poachers can now be shot on sight – not so good for the poachers, but great for the wildlife which thrives in this wonderful park and on many private game farms.

For **David** and **Carolee**, this truly was the trip of a lifetime. Thanks for sharing it with us. Yes, keep wishing on that star because sometimes... dreams do come true.



With that, meeting adjourned. A little past 1:30 pm. **President Hal** closed our meeting with a resounding ring of the Rotary bell.
