Tom Lambert introduced our speaker, <u>Dr. Robert Rubin</u>, shark expert. Tom recounted his good fortune to SCUBA dive with <u>Bob</u> and will never forget the thrill of swimming with the Giant mantas. Tom serves with <u>Dr. Rubin</u> on the Cordell Marine Sanctuary Foundation Board of Directors, one of may board positions that <u>he</u> has held. The foundation is a non-profit that supports the research and educational programs of the Cordell Bank Sanctuary, which is a hot spot of marine life offshore of Pt. Reyes.

<u>Dr. Rubin</u> is back by popular demand. He has given us fascinating programs on mantas and elephant seals. Today he will be talking about sharks. <u>Dr. Rubin</u> is an associate professor emeritus in Life Sciences at Santa Rosa Junior College, but doesn't let his emeritus status keep him from continuing to teach classes. He has been honored by the Carnegie Foundation as the "California College and University Professor of the Year".







<u>Dr. Rubin</u> is also Director of the Pacific Manta Research Group. Recently he and his colleagues were successful in establishing the Revillagigedo Archipelago as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The Revillagigedo are 4 tiny volcanic islands hundreds of miles offshore from the Pacific coast of Mexico.

<u>Dr. Rubin</u> showed us pictures of sharks and rays. We learned that some sharks are partially warm blooded and have heaters for parts of their body. Some sharks are very social, others are loners.



Several other Ukrainian families have moved to Sonoma County (Sebastopol, Santa Rosa, Healdsburg, and Cloverdale.) We look forward to establishing friendships and connections between our club and this family.
