


President Hal Kwalwasser is hoping for a more "normal" meeting today. We shall see.

Our program committee enticed two candidates for Trustee on the West Sonoma County Union High School District Board to come and speak to us today. Each was given a few minutes at the lectern to introduce themselves.

First speaker was <u>Debbie Ramirez</u>. <u>Debbie</u> was a Trustee for the Sebastopol Union School District from 2010 through 2019. She also served on the Analy High School site council 2017-2018. She is a parent of a current Analy student and the parent of a 2020 graduate. She believes she has a good understanding of school budgeting, the education code, Labor negotiation and the Brown Act.



She would like to increase student engagement and community partner engagement with a focus on fiscal responsibility.

The second speaker was <u>David Patrick Nagle</u>. He is presently serving on the High School District Board as appointed Board President. He attended school at Analy. After serving in the military, he returned to Sebastopol and raised three Analy graduates.



He supports a pragmatic approach to leadership and believes he has improved the Board's relationship with the community, teachers and students. He supports the New School Model with a well-rounded education through music, agriculture, sports, drama and CTE offerings.

THE PROGRAM






Richard Power introduced our speaker this week, <u>Patti Wicks</u>. <u>Patti</u> began with a touching video about her mother and her mother in law. Both of these women were diagnosed with Alzheimer's Disease within a short time of each other. Both eventually lived in the same memory care facility and both succumbed to the illness.

There are many types of Dementia. Alzheimer's Disease is one type. There is no cure for Alzheimer's. After fifty years of growing numbers of sufferers, there is still little understanding of the condition and few ameliorative opportunities. Six million suffer from it. And over eleven

million people are providing unpaid care for those stricken.

Between 2000 and 2019, while many serious illness rates went down. Alzheimer's rose by 145%. Patti explained that before 2000, Alzheimer's was so misunderstood that many times diagnosis was missed. It is caused by damage to the nerve cells of the brain. Risk factors include genetic disposition and age. It strikes harder in the Hispanic community, the Afro-American community and among women.





There are currently many studies ongoing to understand the disease. Early diagnosis is the focus as well as drugs to slow the progress. Some drugs have been approved for use among patients with mixed success. *Lecanumab* was recently approved for use by the FDA.

The Walk For Alzheimer's on October 8 at Sonoma State University will raise money and awareness. Continued funding of the various studies is the key to success. Preventative steps include eating well, sleeping well, exercise and keeping alert perhaps through games.
