Ellen Harrington introduced our program. <u>Matt Everson</u> feels so strongly about his program that he is speaking to as many Rotary Clubs as will have him. <u>Matt</u> is a financial advisor but he is not selling in this program. He is urging everyone to be on guard and be willing to protect their most precious documents. It's the modern world and some people haven't been keeping up.

<u>Matt's</u> process was to get the audience thinking by asking questions, then answering them. The documents of which he speaks are things like wills, trusts, deeds and powers of attorney. All of these can have huge impact both to the living and the dead. <u>Matt urges</u> everyone to be aware of the importance of these documents and protect them.



There is no central depository of documents. Even though an attorney may have written them up or helped write them, the attorney is not responsible. The maker is. Deeds can be forged. Trusts can be modified without consent. And a power of attorney in the wrong hands is dynamite. Which can easily explode. The government has no interest in these areas other than that they have written laws that govern them. After that – it is pretty much on you. Matt mentioned the "Dark Web", an area of our modern world wide web which is full of fraud and various instructions about fraud.

<u>Matt</u> urged everyone to protect their important papers. You should let your successor in trust know that they are the successor and also what your wishes are. And what their duties will be. It's no time for secrecy. Have copies of your trust. Share them. The modern age with the internet and ease of moving papers about have opened areas of risk. <u>Matt</u> urged everyone to be vigilant and aware.





The committee will come together for our first group meeting on Thursday, September 22 at JT Martin's home.

The agenda will be to discuss where we are on a major fundraiser in the Spring. We are at the contract stage and will decide whether to move forward with a musical fundraiser in Ives Park or in a different direction. We have been assembling costs, speaking to city officials, security, sanitation, sound, booking agent, etc.

The City of Sebastopol City Council voted at their last meeting to approve a plan that will restore Calder Creek to a more natural setting and at the same time make Ives Park more user friendly. Redwood Empire Food Bank (REFB) - joint workday with the Sebastopol Sunrise club was held on Wednesday, August 24, 2022, from 2-4pm.

<u>Gravenstein Apple Fair</u> - 29 of the 52 volunteer slots were filled by our club members during the August 13 and 14 event. We raised a little over \$1,700 for our club via the stipend offered by Farm Trails for our help at the main ticket gate. Many thanks to all of you that came out to help!

<u>Walk to End Alzheimer's</u> - Saturday, October 8, 2022, at Sonoma State University from 9-11am. All club members can help with fundraising and volunteer to walk. The walk is designed for everyone and includes a very short route (less than a mile) or a little bit longer track (2.5 miles). Entertainment kicks off the event. **Jeff Boal**, **Cindy Carter**, **Richard Power**, and **Gene Nelson** have all signed up to walk. HOMELESSNESS (**Jack Dunlap**, Chair) – The Homeless Committee acknowledges a budget of \$100. We will try to not spend it in one place! We recognize it is a seed to be supplemented by other member or sponsor contributions. There is an ongoing discussion about the need for mentors for the residents of the Horizon Shine Village. We will learn more and share how a mentorship might work.

LEARN TO SWIM (Greg Jacobs, Chairs) - Greg Jacobs is reaching out to all of the schools to confirm their participation in the upcoming Learn to Swim program. We anticipate that we will be back up to 350+ students this year for the four weeks of lessons from April 17 to May 12, 2023. In addition, we are requesting an increase to the budget of \$4,602.53. Attached is the detailed budget request for 2023 for the Learn to Swim (LTS) program - \$14,691.25. The current amount budgeted is \$10,088.72. Greq and I have shared it and discussed it with Jeff Boal and Rick Wilson. Greg has been working diligently with vendors to firm up the bids for shirts and swim bags. Greg and I have continued to refine and update it since the end of last year's program. We can update it again once we hear back from all of the schools with regards to their participation level this coming year. **Greq** is starting to reach out to the schools now to gain their participation for April 17 to May 12, 2023. The budget that was worked up for this year was an average of the past 5 years according to what Ken Jacobs mentioned to Greg. Last year unfortunately dragged the average down. In 2022 there was a smaller than normal Learn to Swim program and 2022 expense numbers most likely should not have been considered when planning a budget for LTS for 2023. 2022 was not a typical year as far as LTS expenses were concerned. Ricardo gave us a reduced pool fee as we only had 150 rather than the usual 350+ students; hence he was able to keep some of his swim lanes and "rent" them out to lap swimmers. The reason for the smaller than normal program was due to COVID. We did not let the schools know that we were even going to have a program until late in the school year as the pool had severe restrictions with regards to the number of children and instructors that could be in the pool at one time. Some of the larger schools were not able to participate as they would have doubled their school bus costs to bring the children in two sessions rather than one session per day (over the eight lessons during the four-week period). We were able to use some of the prior year's swim bags and we had to order far fewer t-shirts due to the reduction in the number of program participants. If we have a more "normal" number of students this year we, respectively request a bit higher budget for LTS than what has been allocated for 2023. We understand that we may have to wait to see if additional funds become available. Thank you for advocating on behalf of this wonderful program.

The Mark Sell Rotary Teacher Grants committee is requesting for tomorrow's meeting that the board allocate up to \$19,000 for the Fall round of teacher grants. This will give us a balance of \$15,422 for the spring round. Once the board approves, we will start work to launch the Fall round.

OVERCOMING OBSTACLES AWARD (Tom Boag, David Schreibman, Rick Wilson, Co-Chairs) -- We are just finalizing the committee membership for Overcoming Obstacles. Twelve members have signed up - many who are founders and who have been with the committee since its start in 2011.

With the beginning of the school year, the Scholarship Administrators at Analy and Laguna High Schools are back, and we have contacted them and informed them that the program will again be running this year. We will ask them to help us suggest an event date for next year (likely in late April, or early May) that works for the students and school – Then we will work with our club's Program Committee to reserve the date.

Once the date is set, we will send a formal announcement of the Overcoming Obstacles Award program, with application requirements, time schedule, and student expectations to the schools to share with appropriate students. The students will - by November 2022 - complete an application, write a special essay about themselves, and provide a recent school transcript for our committee's review. Note that the Overcoming Obstacles Award process is somewhat unique in high school scholarships in that our committee gets to know a lot about the participating students, then make the final decision on which students will participate (confirmed by high school administration). Of course, all contact and information about students is controlled by special Rotary and school procedures.
