
Its 11:20 now and Pres Aleia leaves to set-up the club meeting at the Roto-Palace.

The tour is an economic engine for Sonoma County. <u>Two million spectators</u> come to the race in California. The race is the <u>third most popular bike race in the world</u>. 3.5 billion people follow the race in print, on TV, and online.

Chris showed a short video on the Santa Rosa 2012 race. Levi, who has brought the race to Santa Rosa, is 38 yrs. Old - one of the best riders in the world. The race is a <u>rolling closed course circuit</u>.

The exposure of this race is worldwide. The race will be <u>broadcast</u> around the world. <u>It costs one half million dollars to put on this bicycle race, and it has bought in \$7.6 million in resources over the past years</u>. During questions, **Les Crawford** talked about some other races & some other things, maybe about his kids and bike racing and then contributed \$100...either to Rotary or towards the race.

#4: SECRETARIAT

Many Rotarians consider the Secretariat simply another name for the RI World Headquarters in Evanston, Illinois, U.S.A. Actually, it is much more. While it does include the World Headquarters, the Secretariat encompasses nearly 500 individuals working to make Rotary International run smoothly and effectively. The term describes the entire operations of the general secretary and his staff. The Secretariat also includes eight Rotary Service Centers (formerly called Branch Offices) around the world, all of the staff serving in those centers, as well as all staff assigned to The Rotary Foundation. Its sole purpose is to serve the clubs, districts, and administrative officers of Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation. RI World Headquarters, in a building called One Rotary Center in Evanston, is the headquarters of the Secretariat.
