exhausted president in favor of an invigorated new president.







Bud Daveiro introduced visiting Rotarian <u>Dan Bornstein</u>, Dentist from Santa Rosa.



The Program – Allan L. Bernstein, M.D. -- Strokes

Harry Simms, a long time associate, introduced <u>Dr. Allan Bernstein</u>. He emphasized the research that Dr. Bernstein has done and the leadership that has resulted in the <u>Palm Drive</u> <u>Hospital Certified Stroke Center – One of only two in Sonoma County</u>! He pointed out as well that <u>Palm Drive Hospital Stroke Center has recently won a national award</u>. It has received a Superior Performance award from the Healthcare Facilities Accreditation <u>Program</u>, a national independent hospital accrediting organization recognized by the federal government. Palm Drive Hospital is, so far, the only hospital in California to achieve this distinguished ranking... and only one other hospital in the nation has been recognized.

Description: Neurologists are doctors who diagnose and treat disorders of the <u>nervous</u> <u>system</u>, including the brain, nerves, and spinal

cord. Neurological diseases can be congenital, such as epilepsy, Parkinson's disease or Tourette syndrome; caused by illness, such as Alzheimer's disease or a stroke; or be the result of an accident, such as traumatic brain injury. Neurological exams can include evaluations of balance, reflexes, memory, and head and neck nerves. Diagnostic tests typically involve computer technology magnetic imaging (MRI) (CAT) scans. resonance exams. and electroencephalography (EEG) studies. Related specialties include neurosurgeons, who perform operations on the nervous system, and pediatric neurologists, who specialize in nervous-system disorders of children.



Dr. Bernstein attended State University Of New York Downstate Medical Center College of Medicine; graduating in 1969. He received his Medical License in 1986. He is a board certified Neurologist practicing out of Palm Drive Hospital.

<u>120/80 is a blood pressure we should strive for</u>. Risk factors include: Hypertension, Hyperlipidemia (cholesterol), Diabetes, Obesity, Smoking, Age, Family History, Atrial Fibrillation, HX or TIA's, and decreased physical activity.

Receiving immediate care is the key to a successful outcome if you have a stroke. There is very limited time to act; 4 ½ hours from onset of symptoms to active treatment; Must be observed from the onset; Must be seen by a facility where acute stroke care is available.

The ABC's of Rotary

#22: The Classification Principle

Virtually all membership in Rotary is based upon "Classification." Basically a classification describes the distinct and recognized business or professional service that the Rotarian renders to society.

The principle of Rotary classification is somewhat more specific and precise. In determining the classification of a Rotarian it is necessary to look at the "principal or recognized business or professional activity of the firm, company or institution" with which an active member is connected or "that which covers his principal and recognized business or professional activity."

It should be clearly understood that classifications are determined by activities or services to society rather than by the position held by a particular individual. In other words, if the person is a president of a bank, he or she is not classified as "bank president" but under the classification "banking".

It is the principal and recognized business activity of a business or professional establishment or the individual's principal and recognized business or professional activity that determines the classification to be established and loaned to a qualified person. For example, the permanently employed electrical engineer, insurance adjustor, or business manager of a railroad company, mining company, manufacturing concern, hospital, clinic, etc., may be considered for membership as a representative of the particular work he or she may be doing personally or as a representative of the firm, company or institution for which the professional service is being done.

The classification principle also permits businesses and industries to be separated into distinct functions such as manufacturing, distributing, retailing and servicing. Classifications may also be specified as distinct and separate divisions of a large corporation or university within the club's territory, such as school of business, or a school of engineering.

The classification principle is a necessary concept in assuring that each Rotary club represents a cross section of the business and professional service of the community

In 1995 the Council on Legislation permitted the admission of retired people who had never been in Rotary but would have been qualified. These individuals can be admitted as past service members and are the only Rotarians without a current or former classification.
