## ROTARY CLUB OF FREMANTLE

Networking towards a 'younger Rotary' By Sharon Bagnall and George Booth

In general, many organisations are experiencing

change, whether through technology, aging population impact, retail trends and online shopping etc and to counteract any negative results a pro active vision on solutions is imperative.



Realising the average age of members at The Rotary Club of Fremantle was moving to over 70 plus years old, a proactive team within the Club established, as a trial, a network group of 'younger Fremantle business persons'. One of each kind of profession or trade meet monthly. At one stage Fremantle had 3 Rotary Clubs which are now merged into one Club with 25 Full members and few new active business person members joining mainly due to the average age and lack of opportunity to network their business whilst serving the Community.

The programme has a mission to establish a younger group of persons, who in return for being provided a mentor/speaker on business subjects, will design and execute fundraising events. This group have also provided a source of volunteers on existing fundraising activities run by the Rotary Club and to further develop existing projects through their business contacts.

Some examples of subjects covered: Business Planning, Networking, Marketing, Human Resource tips, The Challenge of Change, Artificial Intelligence impact, maximising media, Value of Tourism, etc.

The monthly meeting on the same night as the Rotary Club meeting enables the participants to grow their data base of contacts, learn current business techniques or trends and debate subjects that are of interest to them.

The Fremantle Rotary Club network group have now been running for nearly two years with 35 participants registered (average attendance at each meeting 25 persons) and some actually joining The Rotary Club, which is the most favoured eventual outcome.

The Rotary Club of Fremantle are constantly looking at ways to recruit more members and the Fremantle Rotary Business Network group is seemingly pointing in the right direction. ◆


