



Rotary remains committed to Ending Polio, and aims to completely eradicate the disease *poliomyelitis* through the vaccination of children throughout the world.

Today there are 98 cases in Afghanistan and Pakistan and our aim is for a Polio Free world.

In order to achieve this, we need to raise funds.

By creating awareness RotaryWA aims to raise \$50,000 to 'End Polio Now' over the next 12 months. The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation will match funds raised by Rotary.

The plan is for Rotarians from RotaryWA to ride the trains throughout the Western Australia Railway network on Friday 24 October promoting End Polio Now to **create awareness.**



Perth has 86 stations and Rotary Western Australia has 86 Clubs.

There are 59 Metro Clubs and 27 Regional Clubs in our District.

Ideally this would mean 5-10 Rotarians from each Club to travel on the train line(s)

closest to their Club.

The journey will begin from 8.00am and ends at 6.00pm.

He is now Head of Ecosystem Engagement at Meshpoints, on the WA Government's Innovation Advisory Board, WA Leaders advisory board and is Chair of Startup WA. In his 'spare' time you may find him doing a parkrun, playing golf or drums and sipping a Shiraz with friends.



- There is extensive poor living conditions and limited access to medical assistance.








Six villages and schools will be provided with water tanks, sanitation facilities, malaria testing and treatment, house spraying, mosquito nets, primary medical care education and training.
