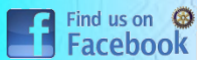

Thanks to Treasurer Steve and to PP John for attending to our Club's budget and other financial side of things.

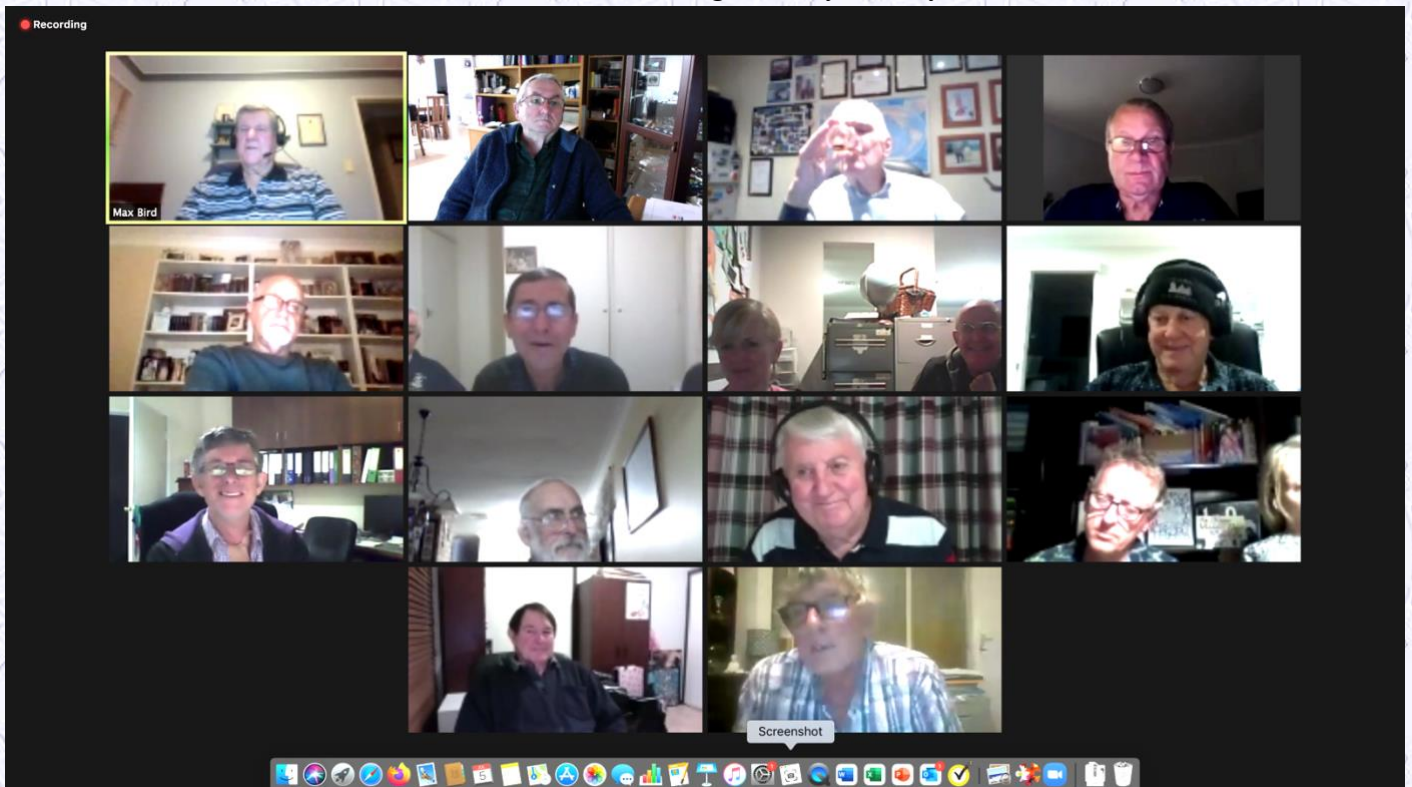
Changeover on Saturday 10 July is set to go ahead, if any changes necessary due to Covid you will be advised ASAP.

**Rotary Projects Timor-Leste East (RPTLE)
7th July 2021**

It has taken us awhile dealing with project management from afar, travel restrictions, Covid 19 lock downs both in Australia and Timor-Leste and the devastating floods in Dili Timor-Leste but we are getting there.

Credit must go to Brother Adriano and the Students of The Don Bosco Technical Training Centre in Comoro, Dili, for completing our very first water container, now supplying approximately 10,000 litres of clean filtered potable water, daily to the students and the local community of the Don Bosco Comoro complex of approximately 1,000 people.

We at Rotary Projects Timor-Leste East (RPTLE) could not have completed this major worthwhile task without the support of all of you working together with Rotary clubs from NSW, Victoria, and Western Australia.

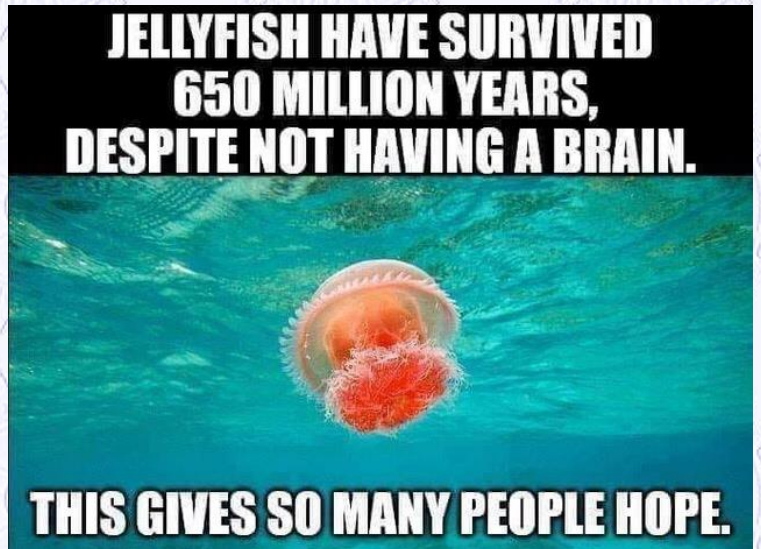
