Summary of new poliovirus this week

- Pakistan: three WPV1 cases and 18 positive environmental samples
- Angola: one cVDPV2 case
- Benin: one cVDPV2 case
- Guinea: one cVDPV2 case
- Indonesia: four cVDPV2 cases
- Kenya: one cVDPV2-positive environmental sample
- Niger: one cVDPV2 case and two positive environmental samples
- Somalia: two cVDPV2-positive environmental samples
