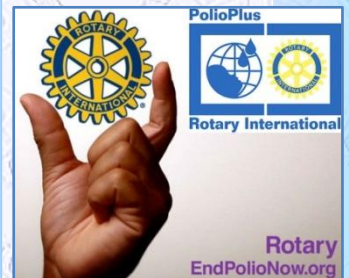

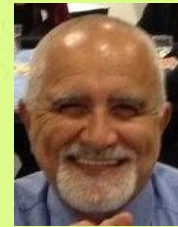

As PP Stephen Castelli was not able to attend the meeting, Norm Mulcahy did the honours and managed to extract a significant amount of money from Rotarians and guests!

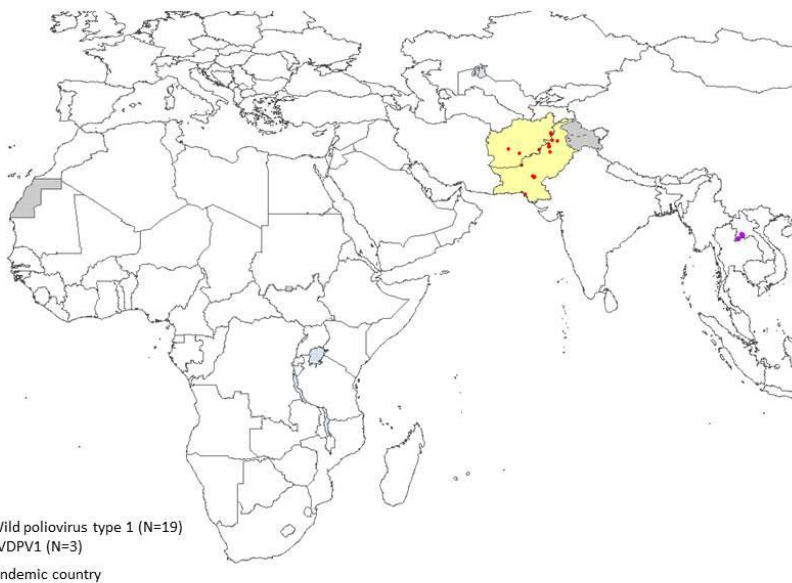
