Water and Sanitation with Rotary Projects Timor-Leste East (RPTLE) & RAWCS

The Rotary Projects Timor-Leste East, Committee With support from RAWCS are carrying out the following.

Looks like I'm Still the RAWCS Wester Region water and sanitation officer for 2023/4

1. RPTLE has confirmed that another 4 x SkyHydrant. water filters have arrived in Dili Timor-Leste, ready to be installed in August & October 2023
2. Tony Miller and myself will arrive in Dili on the 30th July 2023, with a very busy schedule.
3. Stevie and John O'Reilly Major sponsors from DAA and The Rotary Club of Phillip Island, will arrive in Dili on the August 11th 2023 to install one SkyHydrant water filter at Qulelicai, and one Gem Water filter at the Venilale Girls orphanage.
DAA CEO will meet us in Timor-Leste to look at future projects.
4. Kevin Wintergreen has supplied some extra fittings for the Don Bosco drill rig in Timor-Leste has already consigned the equipment though H2O ex Darwin.
5. Visited 2 Bunbury clubs and was very well received.
6. I Have had several conversations with Kingspan Tanks re; Kingspan & Timor Roofing working together in Timor-Leste, allowing the next stage of tank building within Timor to move forward with the building of water tanks between 50,000 to 300,000 litres, I will be meeting the export manager of Kingspan this week to discuss a suitable time for him to go to Timor and meet the Timor Roofing Directors and inspect the factory facilities in Baucau.

During the August trip we will be reinstating the Bagueia village water supply, finely giving the village with a population of approximately 7,000 people fresh water into the village. This will then finalise the remaining Global Grant that I have in force.

Polio this week

12th July 2023

- The Independent Monitoring Board (IMB) is convening this week in Geneva, Switzerland, as part of its rigorous independent review of progress towards the Goals of the GPEI strategy 2022-2026. The meeting will enable the IMB to engage with high-level representatives from polio-affected countries and GPEI partners. The GPEI submitted a summary of key data to the IMB, to help its review and deliberations, looking at both Goal 1 and Goal 2 of the [Polio Eradication Strategy 2022-2026](#). More specifically, this data provides an in-depth look at each of the [most consequential geographies](#). As a group of experts independent of the GPEI, the IMB is uniquely placed to help identify the gaps and programmatic 'blind spots,' and identify where corrective actions might be required. The outcomes of the IMB's review is scheduled to be published the week of 21 August and will be fully evaluated by the GPEI Polio Oversight Board at a face-to-face meeting in October.
- [Africa's polio certification commission](#) calls for urgent action to bolster vaccination: Convening in Kinshasa, Democratic Republic of Congo, on 3-7 July, the Africa Regional Certification Commission (ARCC) urged countries and health partners to urgently address gaps in polio immunity to avert outbreaks. The meeting gathered representatives of national and provincial health authorities from polio-affected countries

- Pakistan: one WPV1 positive environmental sample
- Benin: two cVDPV2 cases
- Central African Republic: three cVDPV2 cases and one positive environmental sample
- Kenya: two cVDPV2 cases
- Madagascar: 19 cVDPV1 positive environmental samples
- Niger : one cVDPV2 case

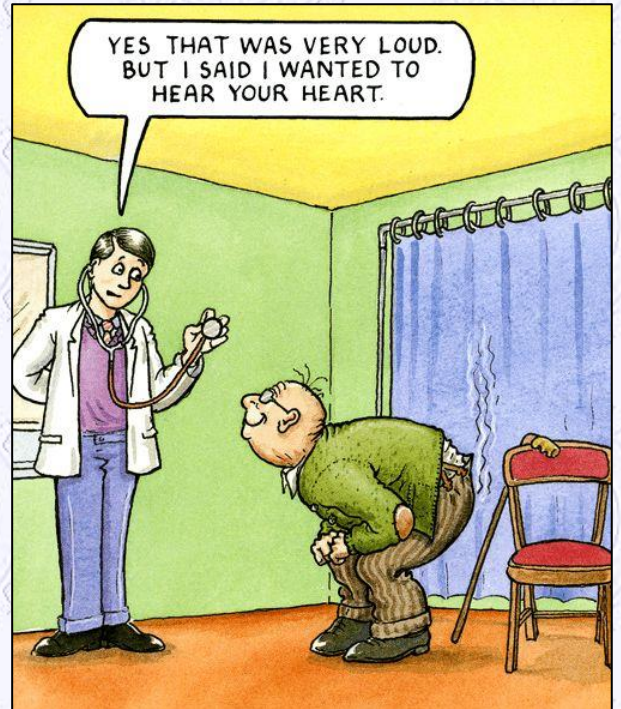
