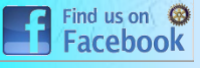

The new plaque erected at Wells Park, Kwinana Beach, marking the 100th anniversary of the running aground of the SS Kwinana onto what is now Kwinana Beach.

The City of Kwinana acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of the land on which we live, work and play, the Nyoongar people. We recognise their connection to the land and local waterways, their resilience and commitment to community and pay our respect to Elders past and present.

City of Kwinana kaditj kalyakool moondang-ak kaaradj midj boodjar-ak ngala nyinyi, yakka wer waabiny, Noongar moort. Ngala kaditj baalap kalyakoort nidja boodjar wer kep kaaradjiny, baalap moortidj nidja yaakiny-ak wer moortidj moort wer kaditj Birtliya wer yeji.

On a stormy night in 1922, the SS Kwinana broke its moorings on Garden Island and came to rest on this beach.

Beneath the boat ramp lies the wreckage of a ship built in England in 1892, named the SS *Darius*, which used to transport horses between Australia and Calcutta for the Currie Line. The *Darius* was sold to the State Shipping Service of Western Australia in 1912 and renamed *Kwinana* in a ceremony in Fremantle.

The *Kwinana* transported passengers and supplies to the North West, returning with cattle to Robb's Jetty in Cockburn. Whilst in State Service the *Kwinana* suffered several mishaps, finally being damaged beyond repair by a fire in late 1920. The ship was stripped of all fittings and taken to Careening Bay on Garden Island. When the *Kwinana* was wrecked, the local area was barely established. Clara Wells ran a small store and post office near this site, and began marking mailbags 'Kwinana Wreck'. The name stuck and was officially adopted for the township in 1937.

In 1941, the wreck was used for an army explosives training exercise, and it was later cut down to water level and filled with limestone and concrete. In the 1960s it provided access to an ocean swimming pool.

The wreck had a cyclone fence erected along the shore side of it with large signs 'Danger - Keep Out'. We kids were not supposed to go on it because of the dangerous nature of the structure. Bus boys being boys, we dived off the wreck, fished off the wreck, we searched all over the wreck.

Malcolm Hughes, 1950s school boy

We explored the old ship from stem to stern on that first morning after she settled in her graveyard on the beach. When we climbed down the gangways into the dark interior, tiny needles of sunlight shone through pin holes in the rusty deck.

Jennifer Jones Imagination Challenge

A program of education for Rotary Clubs that embraces best practice models on membership growth and public image from around Australia and the World



Concept: The sponsoring districts offer 5 places each on a program aimed at providing clubs with the skills and strategies to be relevant to their communities in the 21st century.

The project will include specific support and expertise for each of the participating clubs in accordance with their needs.

Benefits: Successful participating clubs will modernise, improve their public profile, and grow their membership.

Terms: This offer is open to clubs which are committed to modernising and improving value to members, and whose members have voted overwhelmingly to take part (75% or more in favour).

Conditions:

1. Participate in the Club Citation program for 22-23, prioritising membership growth and club modernisation.
2. Participation in a Communities of Practice club development program and other training and development programs related to the project.
3. The club will, within 3 months of commencing the project:
 - a. update data on District website for all members to enable the club to monitor improvements in age, gender balance and other key metrics
 - b. update all club online presences to reflect a modern club profile.
4. The club will maintain one or more contemporary social media platforms.
5. The club will take action to reduce the cost of Rotary to members.
6. The club will take positive steps to making the club more relevant in their community
 - a. *by identifying local community issues and targeting programs to these*

The measurable outcomes

1. Significant increase in membership
2. Significant reduction in average age
3. Significant improvement in demographic balance
